

This little tatted star looks different on each side. It is tatted in 2 rounds, with tie and cut after each round. When tatted in size 40 Lizbeth thread, the star measures 1 and $3 / 4$ inches ( 4.5 cm ) across.

One shuttle and a ball of thread are used for round 1 .
Round 2 looks neater when 2 shuttles are used, switching shuttles for the turns at the inward facing, 6 picot chains.

Techniques used:
Rings R
Chains Ch
Picots p , -
Large picots --
Joins j, +
Lock joins LJ
Reverse work RW
Switch shuttles SS

## Round 1:

R 4-3-2--2-3-4. RW. Ch 2-5-2. RW.
*R 4-3-2--2-3-4. RW. Ch 2+5-2 (j to last p of previous Ch). RW. Repeat from * until the $5^{\text {th }} \mathrm{Ch}$ is reached; end with $\mathrm{Ch} 2+5+2$ ( j to last p of previous Ch , and $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{p}$ of $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{Ch}$ ).

## Round 2:

LJ to $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{p}$ of R on round 1 . Ch 6-6. LJ to $2^{\text {nd }} \mathrm{p}$ of R. Ch $10--10$. LJ to $4^{\text {th }} \mathrm{p}$ of R. Ch 6-6. LJ to last p of R . RW, SS. Ch 1-1-1-1-1-1-1 (6p). Using Sh 2 , LJ to $1^{\text {st }} \mathrm{p}$ of next R. RW, SS.
Repeat around, joining at the 6-6 chains.
