Progressive spiritual growth of incarnated souls occurs naturally when they are physically and psychologically healthy, have a wholesome environment with fresh air and natural light, live creatively, endeavor to bring forth their innate qualities, and aspire to have their consciousness restored to its original, pure wholeness. As the body's nervous system becomes refined and the brain's capacities to process refined states of consciousness are developed, progressive awakening from modified mental states and states of consciousness to Self-knowing, cosmic consciousness, and spiritual enlightenment is effortless. For a person who thinks rationally, the only obstacle to spiritual growth is their passive disinterest. Anyone who sincerely wants to be spiritually enlightened and is highly Self-motivated can acquire and wisely use knowledge of how to live effectively and clarify their consciousness.

Although spiritual growth can continue in subtle realms, it is more useful to intend to be fully Self- and God-realized in our current incarnation, believe that it is possible, and do all that is possible to allow it to be actualized. By writing necessary duties, meaningful goals, and what you will do to more effectively nurture your spiritual growth you will be more intentional and disciplined.

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The Oratory of the Heart

In religious terms, an oratory is a place of prayer, such as a small chapel for private worship. That such a place is set aside in many sacred spaces indicates the realisation that worship is both a communal experience which draws upon the strength of alignment that is created by a consecrated group acting in unified approach to Deity, and the awareness that each individual needs the opportunity to discover the path of approach to Deity by drawing upon his or her inner spiritual reserves.

In another sense, the oratory of the heart is the centre within each human being. It serves a function similar to that of the chapel, offering a place of retreat and withdrawal from outer influences. In this private, hidden centre, the veils of the form world can be lifted and the authenticity of the soul can be encountered in an undeniable way. This is why the first master is the Master in the Heart. Only when the seeker has gained access to this inner centre of light and truth can the guidance of a spiritual Teacher be measured against the touchstone of the heart's own wisdom.

The oratory of the heart is inviolable, for it serves as a space where the most precious spiritual treasures can be guarded in their purest state. "The mystery of life is concealed within the heart", it is said, not in order to hide but to preserve. Right of access to this secret inner place within another human being is granted only to those who have discovered within themselves this innermost centre. Then, the radiation of the awakened heart can cast its light into the heart of one's fellowman, fanning the flames of the central fire that burns silently in the cave of every heart.

Just as we cannot really know another person until we recognise that spiritual essence which is imprisoned within him, so we cannot really know ourselves until we come face to face with the innermost centre of our own being. This we discover in the oratory of the heart—through the privacy and loneliness of the search for spiritual truth no matter what the cost.

Trust in the goodness of the Plan, a deep-seated humility in regard to one's little place in the universe, and the courage to enter the darkness of uncharted territory will eventually open the secret door to the innermost core of our being, the heart. This is a journey undertaken in privacy with the light of the soul as the only guide. And, paradoxically, on that Road each Pilgrim discovers that he travels not alone.

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Loyalty and Sincerity: Twin Pillars of the Spiritual Life SWAMI KRIYANANDA The question is frequently asked: "How do I find true spiritual religion?" I will answer this question by the following illustration:

When a dietician expounds upon the wonderful results of a certain dietary system, Mr. John is very enthusiastic. However, because he never tries out that system of diet, he loses interest in it. But if another dietician visits town, Mr. John goes to listen to him because he remembers the enthusiasm he felt while listening to the first dietician. Mr. John does not try out this new system of diet either, or if he tries it a little, he soon falls back on his unhealthy eating habits. In this way, Mr. John, impelled by a theoretical desire to eat properly, develops the habit of listening to all the new dieticians who come to town without ever following their instructions. But Mr. John should remember that he cannot follow all dietary systems at the same time and that he should not discard a good system of diet for a lesser system, just because it happens to be new to him.

The above principles apply to religion as well. Most people try to follow a variety of teachings yet stick to none. Led only by curiosity, they love to listen to new ideas from new personalities without ever assimilating the ideas. They are like people who set out on a path to reach a certain destination but become so enamored with walking that they keep on walking and forget all about the point they wanted to reach. Just as there is more than one true religion, so also is there more than one path that leads up the mountain of divine attainment. In the beginning of the spiritual search it is wise to seek truth through books and lectures and to compare different spiritual paths and teachers. But it becomes important at a certain point to carefully select the best teaching and the best teacher.

You can find the best teaching expressed in books, but to attain spiritual perfection, you also need the assistance of a guru. The willingness to accept divine guidance through one of God's awakened channels differentiates the sincere seeker from the dilettante. To try to achieve spiritual perfection through a variety of channels shows not only a lack of commitment, but a lack of understanding of the universal path by which all souls find enlightenment. Once you've made your selection, it is important to be firmly loyal to your way. You must simply accept that it is not possible to follow more than one teaching at a time, any more than you can reach a destination by following more than one route at a time. Once you've found a true teaching, the restless searching should cease.

Unfortunately, many students, even after finding a true teaching, continue to read other teachings and to investigate other paths, perhaps hoping to find easier, shorter routes to divine attainment. I once had a student who read other teachings all the time. She was a very nice person, always kind and polite to everyone. But I used to tell her, "Why don't you read your own teachings?"

"Oh, all teachings are the same," she said.

"That's true," I said, "but just the same, if you keep reading everything else you will get confused. You have to realize the truth behind those teachings. Only then will you know from realization that they are the same. Until that time, it will be like trying to cross a river with your feet in two boats. When the boats separate, you will fall between them and drown. Some differences do exist between the various teachings. With wisdom, they can be resolved. To the unenlightened mind, however, though they are superficial, they can be a cause of confusion." Unfortunately, this student didn't heed my advice but kept on with her eclectic reading. After a time, she drifted off.

The very thought, "Oh, all teachings are the same," has just enough truth in it to constitute also a pitfall. Until you have risen above your conscious mind and learned to live more by superconscious guidance, the differences between one teaching and another can easily lead into a bog of confusion. To one who lives by superconscious guidance and is planted firmly on his own path,



the differences between one teaching and another become superficial. Such a person understands the underlying purpose of each path, and sees why the good advice of one teacher may differ in some respects from the equally good advice of another. Newcomers to the path, however, may not perceive the unifying rationale behind those differences, and are often confused by them. Always be wise in your seeking. The emotional excitement of finding new ways must always be balanced against the truth that "loyalty is the first law of God." Eclecticism indicates a lack of serious purpose. This is not to say you should be fanatical, but on the other hand don't be wishy-washy. If you would unite your soul with Him who is the foundation of the universe, you must be firm in what you stand for. Unswerving loyalty to one's chosen path is necessary.

Why do so many people truly long for God, yet do not find him? It is because they do not seek Him with deep sincerity and give up too soon. Always be completely sincere with God. Without sincerity, the necessary focus and intensity will be lacking. God already knows what you are thinking, but sincerity lends power to your thoughts and prayers by focusing and centering them in Him. God never fails to listen to true soul-calls. The devotional call, if sincere, deep and continuous, and supplemented by sincere efforts at deep meditation, always brings a divine response. The sincere truth-seeker tells himself, "I know what an arduous task it must be to achieve perfection, but I will give it all I have. With God's help, success surely must be mine!"

We are living in a new age when the standards of living are less strict. It becomes even more important, therefore, to remember always that the correct spiritual way to live is to go within and ask yourself whether what you are doing is right or wrong. Be absolutely sincere with yourself. If you are sincere you will rarely go wrong, and if you do, you will quickly correct yourself. Sincere repentance for past wrong actions is needed before a person can go forward and make the kind of effort needed to attain divine freedom. For this reason, Jesus wanted to test the character of his fallen disciple, the woman of Samaria, to see if she could be helped. The woman of Samaria had had five husbands and was then living with a man who was not her husband. To determine the degree of her degradation, Jesus asked her to call her husband. When she responded honestly by telling Jesus that she had no husband, he was pleased. Her truthfulness showed that her moral degradation was only temporary. Because of her honesty and recognition of Jesus as the promised Messiah, he was able to heal her. Thereafter, she became one of his disciples and devoted herself to the spread of his teachings.

No matter how far a disciple has strayed from the spiritual life, he can be saved if he is sincere and honest with his guru. Insincerity and prevarication toward the guru are the greatest sins for these are deliberate transgressions, unlike flesh transgressions which are often due partly to instinctive compulsion. It's possible to help wayward souls if they sincerely confess their faults and are willing to accept the guru's advice and blessings. But if the disciple practices insincerity toward his guru and tries to hide his moral disease, he shuts the door to the guru's healing help. Never indulge in hypocrisy or insincerity. Always remember: no matter how far you fall from the grace of goodness, you are spiritually safe if you sincerely try your utmost to become good again.

Meditational Healing Part I

SWAMI MURUGESU MAHARISHI

What is meditation? The answer to this question presents itself in various explanations and techniques. I wish to emphasise that my definition of meditation is as follows: 'Yath Bhavam Thath Bhavathi' Whichever you modify connsciously, that will take place physically. The word 'bhavana' is to be understood well. One layman was asked by his guru to contemplate his favourite3 buffalo as he was not able to think of anything else in the world, even for a few minutes. He began to do so daily and slowly he was able to concentrate on his buffalo. In a few days he was able to pass into the level of meditation. What happened then? In the state of meditation he began to bellow like his buffalo, as his mind and consciousness had modified to that state. Not only this, during normal waking hours he began to behave like a buffalo too. Now his guru asked him to follow the same process, concentrating on a form of deity upon which he was able to meditate well. By doing this, he manifested divine qualities. By meditation on Brahma, one becomes 'Brahma' himself, and all the qualities of Brahma manifest in him.

I hope this definition is understood well. One can develop the power and characteristics of whatever one meditates upon. I also used to explain meditation in the following way to my students: If one meditates on a chair, during deep meditation he or his consciousness modifies into the form of that chair and if anybody strikes that chair he will feel the sensation within himself, but without it being a distraction. As an experiment, I asked my students to meditation on heat and, consequently, their body temperature rose. When they meditate on cold, their temperature lowers. When they meditate on slowing their heartbeat, it decreases. Anybody who can meditate correctly can test this for himself and discover its truth.

Apart from the above assertions, it is well known to those with knowledge of modern psychology, that man can create anything by use of his mind power. Concentration and meditation are the channels through which the mind force expresses itself. The truth is, mind does not actually create anything. It is the consciousness which functions through the mind that creates. It is known to all that miracles performed by yogis are also performed through the power of meditation. Many were able to split atoms, materialise and dematerialise physical things within a few minutes, by their meditational powers which are sometimes considered to be a form of magic.

Here I would like to point out the difference between 'meditational power' and 'mind power'. Many beginners in yoga think that during meditation the mind functions at a high frequency and velocity and on that basis only wonderful benefits are acquired. But this idea is not correct. Mind actually has no power of its own. Its normal functions are carried out by the conscious power which usually flows from the mind outwards into the physical world. If consciousness will, the mind will function more powerfully, but if the consciousness withdraws its hold on the mind for a moment, the mind will become still.

Glory of Yoga

The message of Yoga has yoga has been emphasized for thousands of years by the saints and sages of the world. The real question is: how is yoga any different from any of the religions practiced by millions in the world today? One of the major differences between yoga and any other religion, is that yoga is not a religion. It does not require or confine one's faith or belief in a particular system but rather, strengthens ones faith with the power of experience.

Yoga attempts to draw closed the gap between intellectual understanding and spiritual experience. Whereas most religions put forth a belief system in a particular God or deity, yoga emphasises a scientific system where one can consciously come into contact with God. The dynamic practicality of yogic science makes it the preferred choice amongst sincere devotees who wish to commune with God.

Ashtanga Yoga was developed thousands of years ago for the specific reason to attain inner realisation. The eighth fold path as expressed in Patanjali's Yoga Sutra, represents eight sequential phases in the path to liberation or *moksha*. The first two phases represent ethical practice and moral guidelines. These include truth, non-violence, celibacy, non-greed, non-stealing as well as purity, contentment, austerity and study of the scriptures. These principles maintain a strong foundation for rapid spiritual growth.

The third step is *asana* which has been defined as a physical posture of relaxation. This step is necessary to purify and stengthen the body so that it can sit motionless in meditation. The fourth step is pranayama, which is the scientific art of mastering the breath. In *pranayama*, the *vasanas* or desires are controlled since the breathing rate has a direct correlation with mental activity. The fifth step is *pratyahara*, where one is able to withdraw life energy from the senses and internalise attention. In the sixth step, termed *dharana*, one is able to start contemplating on the object of meditation.

The seventh step is known as *dhyana* which means 'the scientific art of mastering the mind' - where one's attention becomes one with the object of meditation. One achieves mental calm and stillness. Prolonged state of meditation results in the eighth state of *Samadhi*, during which one attains complete absorption in consciousness with no limitation or object remaining.

The sages have mentioned that the eight steps of *Ashtanga Yoga* result in perfection of inner realisation. The result is inner bliss, youthfulness, inner calm, extraordinary concentration and memory, and heightened intuitive capabilities.

My advice to you dear readers this month is to give the science of yoga a chance in this very lifetime and judge the results for yourself!

Science and Religion, Faith and Reason - A Bahá'í Perspective FLORA TECKIE

Religion and science are both important and are necessary for our development. For many centuries there has been conflict between advocates of science and those of religion. There has been a belief that scientific truth contradicts religion and one was obliged to choose between being a religious person and following God's teachings, or a scientist and being a follower of reason.

In the Bahá'í view, religion and science are two complementary sources of knowledge, are mutually dependant and both needed. Science without religion becomes a cruel instrument of materialism, and religion without science falls prey to superstition and fanaticism.

Science and religion are like two wings of a bird complementing each other and the advantages of both need to be used together if we are to build a progressive and peaceful society. Scientific method is our tool for understanding the physical side of the universe and is the key to new technologies. God's teachings offer to humanity a basis for values and provide answers to moral questions, human purpose, and our relationship to God that science cannot provide.

If we look at the religion in its purest form (the way it was revealed through God's Messengers) it is not opposed to scientific facts. God, Who has given us the gift of the intellect, does not expect us to lay it aside when investigating religious truth.

The Bahá'í Writings state: "All religions teach that we must do good, that we must be generous, sincere, truthful, law-abiding, and faithful; all this is reasonable, and logically the only way in which humanity can progress. All religious laws conform to reason, and are suited to the people for whom they are framed, and for the age in which they are to be obeyed". Furthermore, "In divine questions ... we must exercise reason, analyze and logically examine the facts presented so that confidence will be inspired and faith attained".

The independent investigation of reality, whether scientific or religious, is strongly encouraged in Bahá'u'lláh's Writings. Individuals should strive, He said, to free themselves from prejudices and preconceptions. According to the Bahá'í Writings: "... in the search for truth man must weigh religious questions in the balance of science and reason. God has given us rational minds for this purpose, to penetrate all things, to find truth". At the same time "... the principle of harmony between religion and science, while it enables us, with the help of reason, to see through the falsity of superstitions, does not imply that truth is limited to what can be explained by current scientific concepts".

In general science provides us with tools and means, and religion teaches us how to use them to the best advantage of all humanity. For example atomic energy is useful, but without God's guidance it can become one of the most destructive forces produced by science. According to a statement of the Bahá'í International Community: "In the quest for truth, science and religion -- the two systems of knowledge available to humankind -- must closely and continuously interact. The insights and skills that represent scientific accomplishment must look to the force of spiritual commitment and moral principle to ensure their appropriate application".

The Bahá'í Faith is the youngest of the world's independent religions. Its founder, Bahá'u'lláh (1817-1892), is regarded by Bahá'ís as the most recent in the line of Messengers of God that stretches back beyond recorded time and that includes Abraham, Moses, Buddha, Krishna, Zoroaster, Christ and Muhammad.

Many of us get caught in these turbulences, and the first thing we do is give up God and find blame with God. We throw the blame on God at all times. During these times I ask you to let me be your shelter, let me cast my shadow over you. In that protection you will be able to go through those turbulences and live in this ocean of maya without even knowing it.

Understand life differently - that it is more than what you're caught up in. In the *Narada Bhakti Sutras*, it is stated that only true divine love, intensely true divine love, can pick you up from the ocean of this maya, this world. And that true divine love can only come from God. Therefore, you should always, no matter what the situation is, believe that God will always have his hand out towards you. It's just you who have not reached out towards his hand. No matter the situation, whether in business, divorce, separation or work, just remember one thing: the hand of God is always stretched out to you. You just have to lift up your hand and, without fail, God will hold you. But you have not reached up your hand and asked. You bargained with God. He doesn't like bargaining. He likes you to ask him. Tell him that you need him

Creating a Work of Art

Conceiving a child and raising it to feel loved is the most significant action parents can attain. A loved child becomes not only a creative, inspiring being but one who helps all living things to survive and thrive. Think of your child as a young artist who has come to you to learn how to paint or sculpt. As a teacher you would show patience and guide and instruct the child so they can create a work of art. You would not throw out their painting or pottery but show them how to rework it and create a true work of art. Well you have the clay, the paint and the blank canvas to work with; your child.

As a surgeon I listened to eighty five year old parents complain about their kid and I had to laugh remembering they were talking about a kid, who was in his sixties. We can constantly be critical of our children by using phrases like, "There's something wrong with you." Or we can let them know they are loved even when we don't like what they are doing.

I know from working with all age groups that when you ask eighty or ninety year olds whether their parents loved them close to ninety percent answer yes; but when you ask high school students the same question the figures are reversed. When for homework you ask students to write a note about why they should commit suicide and why they are loveable the suicide notes are three to five pages long and the love notes one page. I am not trying to depress all the parents reading this. I have lived the experience with our five children so I know wounds can be healed and that if we are truly educated about the parenting experience our children will be the beneficiaries. Licenses are needed for just about every significant activity or occupation except parenting. So when the birthing classes finish start parenting classes and learn from those who have preceded you and lived the experience.

Why is it your children's children are called grand and their children become great grand children? The answer is that as we grow and mature and learn what is truly important in life we see the children as grand and great. So if you do not have time to read this entire article all I ask of you is to act as if you are a loving grand parent towards your children.

I was born an ugly duckling, who my parents hid in a covered carriage. I survived because I had a grandmother who, to quote my mother, "Poured oil over your body and pushed everything back where it belonged many times a day." I didn't have to find my own beauty, as the ugly duckling did, because I had a grandmother. Studies show the benefits of massage in newborns by their rapid weight gain. So touch and massage your children and watch them grow and develop in response to your loving touch. One teenager I know said she was staying at her grandmother's house and there were no full size mirrors for her to look in before she went off to high school. When she complained to her grandmother her grandmother said, "Come over here and look into my eyes and you'll see how beautiful you are." There are many ways to touch your child.

We must remember the opposite of love is indifference. So the child who feels unloved and drives you nuts gets your attention. While the angel often feels unloved because no one pays attention to him. As one of our children said, "I don't get twenty per cent of your time." I explained his brother drove us nuts and got forty per cent. I admire the fact that he felt comfortable confronting his father with those statistics. When siblings are born one or five years apart there is little rivalry. So apologize, as I have, to our kids and help them become a family. Our children learned that love and appropriate anger can exist together.



Make magic and do things as a family every week. It can be eating out, going skating, visiting a museum, whatever; just make it an activity that allows you to interact and not sit staring at a TV set or a movie screen. When you do the latter have a session in which you all discuss your reaction to what you saw and learn from each other. Various states are currently debating passing laws to ban spanking until age four and not allowing smoking in cars with children under the age of six, while a religious cult in another state wants a law passed to allow whipping of children. I can see the fourth birthday becoming spanking day to make up for what parents weren't allowed to do until that day. It is absurd.

What we need is a law which says you must love your children. I know smokers who smoke outdoors to protect their pets but do not think about their children's lungs. Love is the answer. As Emmet Fox wrote, "There is no difficulty that enough love will not conquer; It makes no difference how deeply seated may be the trouble; A sufficient realization of love will dissolve it all." A young woman I know whose parents are alcoholics started saying to them every morning, "I love you." They never answered her. After doing this for three months she ran out of the house one morning late for school. Her parents were in the street yelling, "You forgot something."

"What did I forget?"

"You didn't say I love you." Their healing began.

Yes, love is a weapon and I prefer to kill with kindness and torment with tenderness.

When we do this our natural tendencies towards aggression are utilized in creative ways through work, sports, games and hobbies and not through destructive behavior. A child's brain wave pattern up to the age of six is like that of a hypnotized individual. So your messages can stay with them for a lifetime. If they are mottoes to die by, and the child does not make a conscious effort to eliminate and abandon them, it does lead to their illness and early death.

A study of Harvard students showed that of those who felt loved by their parents, while attending college, only one fourth had suffered an illness by midlife while almost one hundred percent of those who didn't feel loved had suffered a major illness by midlife. The addictions and self destructive behavior are not an accident. To quote a woman who said her mother always belittled her efforts and only dressed her in dark clothes, "My mother's words were eating away at me and maybe gave me cancer." The cancer motivated her to be born again and redirect her life; reparent herself, find self love and buy a red dress. So curses can became blessings as castles can be built out of the mud.

Centuries ago Maimonides wrote, "If people would take as good care of themselves as they do their animals they would suffer fewer illnesses." So get some pets and treat your children as you do your beloved pets with love, affection, trust, respect, consistency, discipline, exercise and a reverence for life. Those bits of advice actually come from veterinarians. So when in doubt WWLD; just ask yourself What Would Lassie Do?

If your children have any questions just remember love is my answer.

My Mom's answers were, "Do what will make you happy." "Troubles are God's redirections and something good will come of this."

And my Dad's, "Material things are to make life easier and when you are happy you are a success."

The good things you already have come to you along the line of obedience to certain laws.
