Cultivate optimism: expect positive outcomes for all emerging situations. Avoid anxiety, worry, sad moods, and feelings of despair. Remember that you are an immortal, spiritual being superior to your mind. Use your discriminative intelligence to discern the truth of what you are. Consistently think and act from that point of view until it is easy to do.

Regulate mental states and emotions by choice and intention. To think rationally, stay with facts and be practical; don't allow whims or emotions to influence you. 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Was Jesus Christ a 'Firebrand Revolutionary'?

Seldom has a great master come into the world with such an outwardly commanding and heroic role as Jesus. His mission was not only to deliver new statements of eternal truth around which he had to create a new tradition. It was also virtually to wrench old traditions (both practices and attitudes) in a completely new direction.

A bold and powerful self-affirmation

Jesus Christ, even among great masters, was exceptional in his mission, and in his need to affirm his own importance to that mission. Sometimes he spoke in terms that, from anyone who had attained a union with God less perfect than his, must surely have seemed almost embarrassingly boastful and arrogant. He said, for example, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." *

Jesus's elf-affirmation did not indicate any lack of humility. He had no ego of which to be either proud or humble. Jesus came, however, with a particular expression of the eternal truths, and it was necessary for him to focus people's high spiritual aspirations in himself as an instrument of divine grace. Otherwise, the many schools of thought that were rampant in his day would have diluted his message and made it seem merely another "school of philosophy," from whose teachings people could select as they chose.

Reading his words in the Bible, one is nonetheless surprised at how powerfully he affirmed the importance of his own mission on earth. Repeatedly through the New Testament we find Jesus referring, without the slightest hesitation or reticence, to himself. Sometimes he spoke of himself as the "son of man;" sometimes, as the "Son of God." It was, however, necessary for him to speak in that way. Very little valid spiritual tradition remained among the Jews of his time. Few would have been accepted his new expressions of eternal truth had he declared them self-effacingly.

A way-shower and conqueror of unknown territories

The age Jesus lived in was a hard one. He had to survive a public mission in a rough, dogmatic, and intolerant society. Never did he hesitate to "thunder" when the occasion called for a divine rumble. To those who like their saints "soft and cuddly," Jesus would have been—shall we say?—an embarrassment. Indeed, to some people he must have seemed glaringly offensive!

It is, indeed, perfectly understandable that the self-assertiveness with which Jesus so often spoke would have seemed offensive to the unenlightened rabbis of his day. They were, in their own opinion, the supreme authorities in Judaism. If Jesus were to appear and teach in the same way on earth today in any country in Christendom—not as himself, but as someone unknown—I venture to say that almost every priest, pastor, minister of religion, and every other sort of prelate would probably consider his bold self-assertion quite as outrageous as did the Pharisees.

To those at the top of any social ladder, Jesus might well have seemed "pushy" and "a bit over the top." In fact, he was "pushy." It wasn't himself he was pushing, of course, but divine Truth and God. He had come as a way-shower, a road builder, and conqueror of unknown territories. The more restrained and socially approved way of expressing oneself, always with tactful care, was not at all what was needed in his times.

One wonders, even, how the expression — "Gentle Jesus meek and mild" — ever got started. Jesus fitted perfectly the Vedic description of the man of God, as Paramhansa Yogananda quoted it in Autobiography of a Yogi: "Softer than the flower, where kindness is concerned; stronger than the thunder, where principles are at stake."





A "firebrand revolutionary"?

Certain modern writers have claimed that Jesus Christ was a firebrand revolutionary, citing, among other things, his statement, "Think not that I am come to send peace on earth: I come not to send peace, but a sword."

Viewed literally, it would be easy to take Jesus' words as bellicose. Viewed in the broader context of his life mission, we quickly see that he was not issuing an inflammatory call to arms, but speaking thus only to light a fire of divine courage in the hearts of devotees. The conflagration Jesus sought to ignite was a fire of pure love for God, underscored by renunciation of every lesser attraction and attachment.

Jesus' reference to "sword" was a reference to the "sword" of discrimination, essential for slicing through the chains of outward attachment. He also meant "sword" symbolically, referring to the determination one needs to find God.

As for revolutionary zeal, the only "uprising" he encouraged was to urge people to "revolutionize" their inner, spiritual outlook. Jesus Christ came on earth to inspire people to seek union with God. "My kingdom," he said, "is not of this world." Constantly he urged them to seek God-consciousness: "He that taketh not his cross, and followeth after me, is not worthy of me." Christ's message was that the spiritual path is not for armchair devotees but for spiritual warriors, for those who would embrace death itself, rather than abandon their divine search.

Ever since Plato's *Critias* over two and a half thousand years ago, with its description of an ideal society called Atlantis, people from all walks of life, and various disciplines, have searched for the fabled lost city. While the physical hunt has fuelled the media frenzy for the last two hundred years it is really just a side show, Atlantis's real treasure lies in metaphysics, in the lessons it has for us. The clue that the Atlantis story is allegorical is in its source. Plato tells us that he got the tale from an Egyptian High Priest by the name of Solon; the Egyptian Mystery School he represented was one of the repositories of the world's metaphysical knowledge, the stories he would have shared would reflect this.

The basic story, one I'm sure most of us know, is of a Shangri-la gone bad, destroyed by its own technology and lack of moral compass. Sound familiar? "...when the divine portion began to fade away, and became diluted too often and too much with the mortal admixture, and the human nature got the upper hand, they then, being unable to bear their fortune, behaved unseemly, and to him who had an eye to see grew visibly debased, for they were losing the fairest of their precious gifts; but to those who had no eye to see the true happiness, they appeared glorious and blessed at the very time when they were full of avarice and unrighteous power." In this much vaunted year of 2012 the lessons from our long lost antecedents have never been more pressing. Plato hit the nail on the head by saying that it was when things were the most debased that they appeared to those involved "the most glorious..." Like it or not that is just how many live their lives today, profit is more important than people, share holder dividends more a priority than sustainability. Most of us feel so pressured by the material nature of society and the life that we live, that much of our moral compass is ignored. We have forgotten who we are, and what we are an integral part of. This is not sustainable in the long term, as many in the "western" world are now finding out.

The lessons from antiquity are clear. Refocus on humanity and the common good – above all else, strive for eudemonia, harmony and balance, or pay the price. You have a choice.

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Meditational Healing Part II



Meditation actually does not represent any state of the mind. Only concentration represents the focused, one-pointedness of the mind. When meditation is practiced the consciousness begins to slowly slip from the mind, and when meditation is established, the consciousness completely withdraws from the hold of the mind. So the mind becomes still, like an electric fan becoming still due to a power fut. Now the consciousness begins to make contact with the physical world directly, without the medium of the mind or any other factor.

Until one's consciousness retreats from the mind in meditation, it needs the mind to know the material world, and to activate any change in it. But if meditation is accomplished, then the consciousness begins to know and act in the material world without the aid of the mind. The consciousness, though, has the power to materialise anything form the atoms. It acts like a slave to the mind until it transcends the mind. When consciousness retreats from the mind during meditation, it is able to materialise or de-materialse anything through direct cohesion, attraction or repulsion. It is this consciousness which materialises the physical body with the cooperation of the sub-conscious mind, which retains impressions of previous births. So, when the consciousness exits the mind, it is able to materialise bodily cells, group cells and from them form tissues and bones, and thus cause growth of the organs.

Many may hot know how Jesus Christ was able to give sight to a blind man. Manicka Vasagar imposed life and body from a decomposed corpse, and many siddhas gave life to dead bodies. All these seeming miracles are accomplished by what is commonly called 'spiritual healing', during which spirit matter is supplied to the deceased. This is no different to that mentioned in foregoing paragraphs: the power of consciousness exiting the mind during meditation. I therefore hope now, that the reader of this article will believe that by meditational power one can cure any physical or mental disease or disorder, be it for oneself or others.

During meditation the consciousness of the meditator can be directed to the body of the patient and, according to its bhavana, can eliminate accumulated poisons and waste products from organs, cause fresh formation of cells in decayed areas, and correct chemical changes wherever these properties are required - and basically set right all disorders by its power. During meditation the consciousness radiates directly into the sub-conscious mind according to the bhavana, neutralising and removing unwanted bad influencing impressions from it and implanting beneficial impressions instead, which then begin to act accordingly. Although a hypnotist makes similar changes in one's sub-conscious mind, the subject often regains the negative impressions that were removed by the hypnotist and may relapse into negative habits or states again. But in meditation there is no chance or regaining removed impressions as the structure of the subconscious itself has been altered by the direct action of the Spirit. If a patient who was spirituall healed, wishes to walk the spiritual path, he will do so easily and without much labour. By meditational healing a dull and absent-minded person can become fully active-minded; a cruel man can become a pious one, and a weak-minded person can gain will-power.

Eternal Values SUREN PILLAY

The essence of spirituality lies in the universality of common values. These values of truth, faith, devotion, love, and beauty are immortal and reflect the inner success secrets of most affluent societies. It is, therefore, not surprising that most of the values mentioned also have spiritual significance.

Truth or *satyam* is mentioned in Patanjali's *Yoga Sutra* as a requirement of ethical behaviour. Many aspirants may ask why truth carries such importance in the spiritual journey. The answer may be found in the fact that every word, thought, and action should be harmoniously in tune with the vibration and energy of nature. When a person speaks a lie, he consciously expressly a mismatch between the reality of what is and what is said. This mismatch does not serve the individual in any useful way and may be of further detriment to him as if someone is able to find out about the lie, it is likely that the liar will suffer some pain in the process.

It is said that a man without faith in God will find the spiritual journey a very tough one. It should be noted that faith is not belief, even though both terms are often used interchangeably. Belief can, in many instances, be of weak substance or poor faith, in which case such belief is not transformative. Real faith only blossoms when an inner experiences arises within an individual. Such experiences transform the individual on multiple levels, simultaneously, such that he innately realises the presence of something more than what is apparent.

Without devotion to any particular goal or objective, it is unlikely that such goal or objective will be achieved. The price of success, in either the material or spiritual plane, is often the result of perseverance. It has been said that mastery in anything is the result of 10000 hours of sincere practice in that subject. Devotion to attaining enlightenment by following the principles of the scriptures are thus a most necessary requirement to attaining spiritual liberation.

Love is that which connects all of us at our most deepest level. It is that which is the subject of the most deepest spiritual experience. The purest form of love is the unconditional love of God. This is attained through repeated spiritual practice with faith and devotion. When the unconditional love of God is attained, then a man can truly love another man without bias or prejudice. A man is only truly prosperous when he experiences and expresses love in every aspect of his life.

Beauty is the result of attaining love of God. It the end result of spiritual perfection. People who have attained the state of *mukti* or liberation, live lives of true beauty and authenticity. They do not wish to conform to any social ideal prevailing at the time but automatically abide by the laws of nature effortlessly. The result is perfect harmony with natural laws and all creatures of the Almighty.

In conclusion, I would like to say that a life without values is likely to be susceptible to decay and destruction, both material and spiritual. It is values that hold societies in harmony, wealth and health; and the same values can be applied to a human being at a micro level.

My advice to readers this month is to try and live the eternal values noted for a more complete and fulfilling life!

Joyous celebrations to greet the New Year - A Bahá'í Perspective Flora teckie

The Baha'i New Year festival known as Naw-Ruz (literally "New Day") is held on 21 March.

The festival comes at the end of a 19-day fast in which Baha'is abstain from food and drink between sunrise and sunset as a reminder of the need for individuals to be detached from their material desires. Naw-Ruz is the first day of the first of 19 months in the Baha'i calendar.

The Baha'i New-Year coincides with the vernal (spring) equinox, the first day of spring. It is the time of freshness and renewal in nature. It is also symbolic of the periodic renewal of the religion of God - the coming of the spiritual spring.

The Bahá'í calendar is based on the solar year. It begins on March Equinox and is divided into nineteen months of nineteen days each month. Four intercalary days are added (and in the leap years a fifth day) to make up the year. The months are named after some of the attributes of God such as might, glory and grandeur. The Bahá'í calendar dates its years from 1844, which marks the beginning of the Bahá'í Era. This year is 169 B.E. (Bahá'í Era).

Founded by Bahá'u'lláh over a century and half ago, the Bahá'í Faith is today amongst the fastest growing religions. With followers in at least 235 countries and dependent territories, it embraces a cross section of the human race and has become the world's second-most widespread religion in its geographic reach, according to the Encyclopedia Britannica. Its Founder, Bahá'u'lláh, teaches that there is only one God, that there is only one human race, and that all the world religions have been stages in the revelation of God's purpose for humankind. As Bahá'u'lláh wrote: "The earth is but one country and mankind its citizens."

The coming together of the peoples of the world in a harmonious relationship is the most crucial need of today. As stated in the Baha'i Scriptures: "The well-being of mankind, its peace and security, are unattainable unless and until its unity is firmly established."

At the present time the Bahá'ís of South Africa, as well as the Bahá'ís in every other country are engaged on a path of action that promotes the spiritual development of the individual and channels the collective energies of its members towards the spiritual transformation of society. These activities include the systematic study of the Baha'i writings in small groups in order to build capacity for service; devotional gatherings which are aimed at connecting the hearts of the people with their Creator; neighbourhood children's classes that offer lessons aimed at laying the foundations of a noble and upright character; and groups that strive to assist young teens to navigate a crucial stage of their lives and become empowered to direct their energies toward the advancement of civilization. This is a process that seeks to raise capacity in the individuals to take charge of their own spiritual, social and intellectual development. The inward and outward transformation of the individual will of course contribute towards a collective transformation in society and towards Bahá'u'lláh's vision of a prosperous and peaceful civilization.

The Bahá'í Faith is the youngest of the world's independent religions. Its founder, Bahá'u'lláh (1817-1892), is regarded by Bahá'ís as the most recent in the line of Messengers of God that stretches back beyond recorded time and that includes Abraham, Moses, Buddha, Krishna, Zoroaster, Christ and Muhammad.

You know, I was thinking about the difference between love and the bank. They are so similar, yet there's a big difference. When you have enough money in the bank, then they want to give you more. When you have no money, then they won't give you any. When you have enough love, you don't need any love. But when you have no love, you search for love.

Osho said, 'How true is this love?' Do you really know the meaning of love, and if you know the meaning, does the other person love you as much as you love them? So you are fully occupied with this idea: 'Am I getting as much love as I should be having in this relationship?' And it continues for a long time this thought, this constant thought in your head, 'I love him so much. Does he love me as much?' And just as the interest you owe the bank adds up, when you don't pay them they attach everything you own, it's the same with love. Eventually this idea you have that the person you love doesn't love you as much, destroys you. So you become totally destroyed, and an emotional wreck.

Osho also said that if you really want to enjoy love, seek it when you have enough of it, when you don't need it, and you'll find the right one. Love is not two strangers meeting each other. Love doesn't happen at first sight. It's a growing process. You need to acquaint yourself first, know the person first, understand the person first, and then develop a relationship that you can call love. Anything that has to change, needs to grow. So anything that grows has changed. And anything that does not grow is dead. Love is like that. As long as it's not growing it's dead. If you look around you, the reason we say the tree is still alive is because it's changing and growing. The day it stops growing and the branches go brown, we say it's dead and we cut it down. As long as it doesn't stop growing, it's alive. The day it stops growing it's not alive at all.

So we need to cultivate this love for God, not for human beings. No human being can love another human being. We use these words loosely. If you are going to the park with your boyfriend or girlfriend you say 'I love you,' fifty times because you don't have anything else to say. You can't talk about how the atom bomb was manufactured because you don't know.

With God you don't have to say 'I love you'. And God won't tell you that He loves you because He doesn't need to. The fact that He gave you this human body means that He loves you dearly. It is God's gift to you. He has put you here for free. He gave you free sunshine but the municipality charges you for electricity. He's given you rain and the municipality charges you for water. Not one day did God ask for it back, or ask you to pay for it. So He constantly loves you and He's given you this thing called 'prana', which He gave to the Sun first. He has not restricted you in that. He's allowed you to breathe as fast as you want or as slow as you want, so you can live as long as you want by your breath. That is the greatest love.

Communication, Messages and Signals

The key to life in all its forms is its ability to communicate. This includes the ability of complex organisms like ourselves to communicate with each other but more importantly within ourselves, our individual organs and cells. How do animals communicate without words? Studies show they can count and make intelligent choices when given options yet we do not know how they are able to reason and communicate without using words.

Life began with one celled organisms who learned how to communicate by altering the chemistry of their environment. In times of danger they would secrete substances which led them to come together into a balls of cells which would survive adverse living conditions like droughts or temperature fluctuations. Today these same methods of communication go on within us but problems arise when we do not pay attention to these messages of danger because of our level of consciousness. Notice I didn't say intelligence. If we were intelligent we would pay attention to the messages we are giving our bodies and they are giving us so that the intracellular signals would be life enhancing and not disease inducing.

Think of the simple fact that Monday has a higher mortality and suicide rate then other days of the week and you begin to see why we are not the wisest of creatures. Bacteria develop resistance to antibiotics by intelligent alterations in their genetic mechanisms and survive. We can't even get through the week without succumbing to adverse conditions.

I also marvel at the intelligence within a seed. Did you ever notice how seeds will sprout and grow through pavement to survive. How do they know which way is up without sensing warmth? There is a sense of gravity within a seed and they don't give in to adversity when they run into obstacles. They push forward or find new ways to reach the light. What signals them to keep going and not succumb?

The method of communication has to be chemical signals within the cell directing its behavior but how a protein molecule thinks and knows what to do is beyond me and probably science's understanding. It is awesome to think of one cell developing into a human being and differentiating into all the components we are made of and getting them to develop in the right places too. Think of the endless number of signals which must be given to each intracellular component to do this.

Now think of the signals this organism receives after it is formed. What does a touch, hug or caress say to it about living? What do unexpressed fears, despair and depression tell it about the desire to live. Every cell in our bodies is aware of our will to live and our desires and intentions. The emotional and the physical are one. Mind and matter are not separate entities. Just as one celled organisms reacted to their environment our cells react to both our physical and emotional environments because there is a chemistry to both.

The question is what messages are you giving your body so that the signals created are life enhancing and not life threatening. I think the key words and signals are inspiration and expiration. We use the latter when things are ending. When someone dies we say he expired. The breath of life has left.

Inspiration is a word that fills us with the joy of living and our desire and intention to survive. Inspiration means breathing in but it also speaks of being inspired to create life and survive hardships. When I meet an inspired individual who is living a meaningful life I know they will live longer in the face of adversity then others with the same afflictions or problems. I believe this is why some people overcome so called incurable diseases. They find new meaning in life and signal their bodies that their desire and intention and determination is to live. They are not ready to expire because they are inspired to live, love and serve.




Their bodies get the message and changes occur which lead to their healing and curing themselves and their bodies. Now we are getting somewhere. Like the bacteria we are living with a sense of our mission here and role in creation and respond to adversity with a will to live. We see this idea supported by research being done today. Join a support group or simply keep a journal of your feelings and you slow the progression of your disease, reduce the number of symptoms, lower the recurrence and death rates. It doesn't matter what the disease is. The will to live is physiologic and communicated to every cell in your body.

Remember the song, "Eat an apple every day. Go to bed by three. Take good care of yourself. You belong to me. Be careful crossing streets. Don't eat meats 'cause you'll get a pain and ruin your tum, tum." You don't know how lucky you are reading this and not having me sing it to you. The latter might create some negative signals to your body.

The message is clear. Give your body messages and signals related to your inspiration and will to live. Your body will do the best it can to sustain you when you do so. Exercise produces neuropeptides which protect the cardiovascular system. Massage enhances growth and immune function. The beneficial effects of love are not an accident. So find your reason for living now and get going. Then you will never be working and Mondays won't be a threat to your health.

One last word of advice. This article is not written to help you avoid disease and death but to help you enjoy life. In Heaven the grumpiest people are the vegetarian, meditating, joggers who despite eating only vegetables, meditating regularly and getting up early every day to jog died anyway. So do what feels right because that is how those chemical messages from your body are communicated, through feelings and not what is thought. The body signals us too. The mind matters and feelings matter and when we live right they are the healthiest unit they can be. Consciousness and matter unify and become one through the inspirational signals we provide. So get in touch with your body.

Thinking in the Certain Way

You must form a clear and definite mental picture of what you want; you cannot transmit an idea unless you have it yourself. You must have it before you can give it; many people fail to impress Thinking Substance because they have themselves only a vague and misty concept of the things they want to do, to have, or to become.

It is not enough that you should have a general desire for wealth, "to do good with"; everybody has that desire.

It is not enough that you should have a wish to travel, see things, live more, etc. Everybody has those desires also. If you were going to send a wireless message to a friend, you would not send the letters of the alphabet in their order and let him construct the message for himself; nor would you take words at random from the dictionary. You would send a coherent sentence, one which meant something. When you try to impress your wants upon Substance, remember that it must be done by a coherent statement; you must know what you want, and be definite.

You can never get rich, or start the creative power into action, by sending out unformed longings and vague desires.

Go over your desires in detail. That clear mental picture you must have continually in mind, as the sailor has in mind the port toward which he is sailing the ship; you must keep your face toward it all the time. You must no more lose sight of it than the steersman loses sight of the compass.

It is not necessary to take exercises in concentration, nor to set apart special times for prayer and affirmation, nor to 'go into the silence', nor to do occult stunts of any kind. These things are well enough, but all you need is to know what you want, and to want it badly enough so that it will stay in your thoughts.

Spend as much of your leisure time as you can in contemplating your picture, but no one needs to take exercises to concentrate his mind on a thing which he really wants: it is the things you do not really care about which require effort to fix your attention upon them.

And unless you really want to get rich, so that the desire is strong enough to hold your thoughts directed to the purpose as the magnetic pole holds the needle of the compass, it will hardly be worthwhile for you to try to carry out the instructions given in these articles.

The methods herein set forth are for people whose desire for riches is strong enough to overcome mental laziness and the love of ease, and make them work. The more clear and definite you make your picture, then, and the more you dwell upon it, bringing out all its delightful details, the stronger your desire will be; the stronger your desire is, the easier it will be to hold your mind fixed upon the picture of what you want.

Something more is necessary, however, than merely to see the picture clearly. If that is all you do, you are only a dreamer and will have little or no power for accomplishment.

He moves from lap to lap, day after day, giving selfless love and bringing joy to his patients.

Divine Love needs no words to communicate. One patient in particular, who suffered a stroke, is especially appreciative of Norman's attention. She always welcomes him with a big smile and outstretched arms. They set off for an adventurous ride in her wheelchair.
