### **Knowing God**

Human beings evolved to their current stage of physical and mental development during the past one million years—much less than the duration of a blink of an eye when compared with approximately 4.5 billion years of Planet Earth's existence and 13 to 18 billion years (estimates vary) since our universe came into space and time. Written languages emerged only a few thousand years ago. The earliest civilizations—where communities were organized, crops were planted and harvested, animals were domesticated, business transactions enabled people to be more prosperous, and activities and projects for the public good were provided—started a little more than ten thousand years ago in the Middle East, India, China, and a few other regions of the world. Extremely rapid technological progress has occurred during the past 150 years. In the early 1900s, before motorized vehicles were widely available, trains carried longdistance freight and horse-drawn wagons and machinery were common. During the past few decades dramatic changes have occurred: convenient air travel is available; television and the Internet enable personal communication to occur with the speed of light; healing methods are more advanced; the smallest units of matter are being explored; astronomers are discovering surprising facts about our universe; and more people are sincerely interested in how to be spiritually conscious and freely functional.

### The Emergence of Influential Philosophical Concepts and Religious Ideas and Practices

Beginning approximately 3,000 years ago and lasting more than 600 years, in various regions of the world new philosophical and religious ideas that were to be influential for many centuries were either revealed or imagined and widely disseminated. During that historical period, now called the Axial Age, the interest of millions of people turned toward higher realities. Before then, groups of people from what is now the southern region of Russia had migrated to India, Iran, and parts of the Middle East and Europe. They called themselves aryans or "noble" people. Their language evolved into Sanskrit, several European languages, and English. In India, Vedic (considered as "revealed") scriptures were orally transmitted for centuries before being written, religious rituals were performed, and Sanatana Dharma (the eternal way of right living), named Hinduism by foreigners, evolved. Buddhism followed a few centuries later and spread to Sri Lanka, Tibet, and Asian countries (and within the past century to Europe and America). In Persia, now Iran, a religion founded by Zoroaster flourished for a few centuries. Elsewhere in the Middle East, Judaism evolved, and later Christianity. A few hundred years after the appearance of early Christians, Islamic religious ideas and practices began to spread. Some of Zoroaster's doctrines, such as an imaginary satanic influence and an end-ofhuman-history event during which God (or his agents) will judge the actions of souls and permit some to enjoy eternal heaven-like existence while decreeing that others suffer or be killed for their wrong-doings, are included in some Jewish, Christian, and Islamic traditions. While Buddhism was emerging in India, in China the writings of Confucius (K'ung ch'iu, "Master Kung") and Laozi ("old teacher") were becoming influential. Historians say that hard facts about them are difficult to discover because biographical information which may be true is mixed with myth and stories. The Dow Te Ching, a concise text attributed to Laozi, explains the "Way" (Dow) to think and act in harmony with the essence and origin of all things. It declares that the "true Way" must be insightfully comprehended and lived rather than superficially analyzed or debated. (To be continued)

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### Revealing the Plan of God

Sublime emanations of the Divine are constantly pouring potencies of light and love into the mind and heart of the human race. Great Beings on the inner side (the Saints, Rishis, Angels, Ancestors and Lords of Compassion acknowledged by every spiritual teaching down the Ages) organize, direct and guide this flow of Fire.

Human history is a record of the tension between inherited understandings, beliefs, ideals and the inspirations, intuitions, energies flowing into consciousness from the divine. Fire meets fire, and in the process human beings, cultures and epochs move through cycles of birth, maturity and death.

Right now, in our time (a period of history that we might, for the sake of simplicity, think of as the hundred years spanning the mid points of two centuries: 1950 - 2050) the tension is high as a new epoch is in process of being born. Everything about our own personal lives, everything we do in our professions and work places, everything happening in our communities and nations, our temples, schools, hospitals, laboratories, art galleries, banks, farms and political assemblies – everything reflects this tension between the Fire of the divine and the fire of the human response.

And so, in the most private, silent, intimate core of our being we align with our triangle partners and affirm: Let the Plan of Love and Light work out. The Plan is God's Plan – a divine vision in which the future of humanity and the Earth, the possibility of who and what we are becoming, stands silently, potently before us and within us. It is not for us to know the details or the timing of this future. It will after all be worked out in a living way, determined as much by the creativity, faith and intelligence of human response, as by the forcing dynamic of the spiritual stimulation that flows from the divine.

What we do know is that God envisions a future humanity centred on relationships expressing principles of synthesis, wholeness and inclusiveness. As these principles are revealed and unfolded through our lives and through the lives of millions of people of goodwill the world over, so will the new civilization of unity in diversity envisioned and planned for by all the Principalities, Angels and Deities of the Inner worlds emerge in outer expression.

In the future epoch humanity will have chosen to live in balance with the Earth, creating an infinite range of political, religious, economic, educational and scientific expressions of synthesis. Right now painful, all engrossing, life and death problems are leading us to the place of choice. It is divinely ordained – yet still the story of our response to God's movement within us is made up of countless small steps of goodwill.

The activities of the Lucis Trust promote the education of the human mind towards recognition and practice of the spiritual principles and values upon which a stable and interdependent world society may be based.

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### Who is Divine Mother?

First of all, we need to understand that Divine Mother is not a separate thing or person, but is the feminine aspect of God. There's really only one reality-the Infinite Consciousness that has produced all the different manifestations we see. But there can be different expressions of the Divine that appeal to people according to their own natures.

Some years ago it came to me in meditation that what America needs is more consciousness of the Divine Mother to balance out the overly masculine, intellectual approach that is dominant here. With all our great mental insights, we've failed to realize one simple truth: this world is not real.

In essence, we are a part of the Infinite, and it's God who's playing our particular role in life. God is uniquely present in each one of us, and has His own song to sing through everyone. The whole purpose of this great drama is-to realize that you are God.

But we must be careful. We can't correctly say, "This body is God. This personality is God." No. But God is you-this is correct. In the end, Self-realization means to know that the whole universe is a part of our own reality, and that in our basic nature, we are infinite.

#### You are Divine Mother

Now, what is Divine Mother? You are Divine Mother. There can't be any difference, because there's no separation in the Infinite. When God brought this universe into existence, He could only do it out of His own consciousness. He had to dream it into existence. The beauty of this thought is that all the love of the universe is also a part of you.

What part does Divine Mother play in this? She gives us a form towards which we can direct our love. It's not wise to say, "When I love myself I'm loving God," because then you're thinking of the wrong self. So it's helpful to think of God as something outside and separate from ourselves.

The difference between human love and divine love is this: Divine love is without limit or form, while human love tends to take the Infinite and condense it into one person. This tendency is good in a sense, because it gives you a focus for love--without that it would be vague. We need a concrete concept of God-a beloved, or friend, or wise person- even though He is really without form. Having a concrete image is like having stepping stones that bring us to the point where suddenly we see it's all Him.

#### Devotion starts with a form

To develop devotion for Divine Mother, in the beginning we often need to think in terms of a human form. When I first came to Master, I was tired of being intellectual and wanted to develop devotion. I began praying to Divine Mother, and used to visualize the face of my godmother. That may seem ridiculous, but she had a very loving nature that reminded me of the innocence and sweetness that I was trying to develop. In this way, I gradually tuned into the consciousness of Divine Mother, so that when I think of Her now, I don't think of any form.

The trouble with worshiping God only as Father is that He tends to present an image of a judge-somewhat stern and aloof. But Divine Mother is filled with compassion, and will forgive you even if you've done wrong. Master said, "Pray to the Mother, 'Naughty or good, still I'm your child, and you must help me."





God is all forms and no forms. I don't ask people, "In what form do you worship God?" I don't ask the people at Ananda to worship God as Divine Mother. I think that many of them do-I do. But I don't say that they have to, or even that they should, because in each one of us there is some form of God that deeply satisfies us.

There's a very interesting story about Sri Yukteswar that I've mentioned it in my new book, A Place Called Ananda. Sri Yukteswar had a young disciple who was very dedicated, but still had a longing for human love. One day they were on a train, and Sri Yukteswar said, "Divine Mother will answer your prayer today." After a time they stopped at a station, and he pointed, saying, "Look out the window." Sitting in a train opposite them was a girl who somehow was the complete fulfillment of all his desires. From that mere glimpse of her, he had no more desire for human love.

### Never lose sight of the Infinite

We need the limited to remind us of the Infinite. But even if God should come to you as the Divine Mother, or as a friend, or a beloved, always see the Infinite Consciousness behind those eyes. This is what Master taught us to do.

I used to notice with Yogananda that he could be laughing joyfully, or scolding, or teaching, or talking about a pothole in the driveway that needed fixing, but when I looked into his eyes, I saw that there was no personal desire. It was as if the Infinite was looking at me through those eyes.

I'll never forget once when I was sitting at his feet while he was editing a manuscript, and I was thinking how fortunate it was that I had found him. When he finished his editing, he asked me to help him stand. He looked into my eyes with so much joy and love, and said, "Just a bulge of the ocean."

I was loving the form, but it's the ocean that had produced that form. It's the ocean that has produced all our forms. Ultimately, love of Divine Mother is only love of your own true self. You need always to bring it back to that reality, not in self-love, but in the realization that God is everywhere, and you, too, are everywhere.

As Master wrote in a letter to his chief disciple, Rajarsi Janakananda, "Don't look just with your physical eyes. Think of things behind you that are out of your range of physical vision, and try to see them. In this way, bit by bit, you will develop omnipresence." This is how we worship Divine Mother.

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### Clairvoyance: exercises

Look at a picture of a simple object for a few seconds. Then close your eyes and visualise it, remembering as much detail as you can. Look at the picture again, and then close your eyes again and try to remember more detail than the previous time. The more you repeat this exercise, the greater the amount of detail you will see in your visualising. If you practice this correctly and sincerely, you will begin to see minute details of the image in your mind (the mental plane), and when comparing it with the physical object, you will notice the same details that may not have been ordinarily seen.


Repeat this exercise with different images and articles like fruit or appliances, noting down the minute particulars that you see with your astral eyes, and comparing them with the physical image. Once you are satisfied that you are able to steadily hold a mental image and study its characteristics in detail, carry out the same exercise using the image of a person as follows:

Sit in a quiet place, contemplate on a mental figure of a well-known friend or relative for three to four minutes continuously. Then when you happen to meet your friend or relative, make a note whether the details you observed mentally are correct. Repeat this exercise with numerous male and female associates. Study their mental images and then compare them with those you observe physically.

You may find it difficult at first but practice will help you to succeed in due course. Mastery in these exercises will qualify you to practice higher clairvoyance. So overcome your failures and persist in the exercises.

To better your abilities even further, carry out the same procedure you used in the foregoing exercises, but instead visualise a building: the house of a friend perhaps. Hold its outer structure in your mind then slowly step inside and mentally observe each room and its contents. Spend about thirty to forty minutes on this. At a convenient time, visit the building you visualised to establish which particulars were correct. At first you may have visualised only a few items correctly but, with regular practice, you will be able to get most of the detail correct.

As you master these exercises, continue to mentally explore larger buildings such as shops, warehouses or sales emporiums. Make notes of your experiences so that you can be aware of your progress and be encouraged to continue practicing.

### The role of the intellect

Much has been said of the role of the intellect in society today. No doubt, without the intellect one could not reason or find solutions to difficult and challenging problems. But is the intellect the ultimate source of peace and bliss in ones life? Many philosophers have different answers to that question. Philosophers who are proponents of the intellect say that the mind is subservient to the intellect and that the more focused the mind is the stronger the intellect is.

Intellectual power is thus gauged by the extent to which one is able to control one's own mind. Focus and concentration are the natural result of a strong intellect. Proponents of this theory also argue that the intellect is fundamentally different to intelligence which is the storehouse of all emotions memories and impulses. A person with a weak intellect allows the fluctuations of the mind in the form of emotions, impulses and memories to influence his current and future decisions. A strong intellect is naturally focussed in the present moment, as the anxiety of the past and anticipation of the future do not affect its awareness and focus.

There are other philosophers who indeed give some approval of the intellect as a great source of power, wealth and happiness but not lasting happiness. These philosophers usually write from personal experience in Bhakti Yoga (yoga of devotion) or Raja Yoga (yoga of meditation). These philosophers state that the critical importance of intellect lies in its ability to reason correctly and make wise decisions for greater individual and cosmic upliftment. The purer the intellect, the wiser decision-making becomes, and the easier the spiritual journey and the path to bliss is.

Bhakti and Raja yoga philosophers confirm that the ultimate source of bliss lies in first connecting with ones self and then with God. This process is experiential not intellectual. The intellect is still limited in its capability, and inadequately equipped to experience the vast magnitude of the entire cosmos. However, if one is able to move their awareness beyond the intellect to the domain of spirit, and achieve meditative oneness with God, they will be able to attain inner bliss and simultaneously express all the qualities of a dynamic and powerful intellect.

In my experience of both reading various spiritual philosophies and practicing many different spiritual techniques, I am convinced that the argument of the Raja and Bhakti yogis hold true. The argument that mastering the intellect allows you achieve perfection in life, is not accepted. This is established due to the fact that some people who have demonstrated strong intellectual capability have not been the most blissful, or lived very wise lives. Mastering the intellect is a critical key on the path to self realisation as one-pointed focus is necessary in order to attain oneness with the creator.

My message to you this month, dear readers, is to engage in spiritual practices that will allow you to experience your spirit. However, you should use your intellectual power to your advantage by developing it and focusing it on constructive outcomes. Then you will be a beautiful synergy between intellectual development and spiritual perceptions.

This is because the training, which children receive at young ages is much more effective and sustainable.

The National and the Universal Children's Days in November should serve as a reminder of the importance of the appropriate training of our children and the empowerment of younger generation in creating better communities and a peaceful world.

Child-rearing is not only a source of great joy and reward, but it is a sacred obligation. According to the Bahá'í Scriptures: "Every child is potentially light of the world and at the same time its darkness" "... the aim of an educator is to so train human souls that their angelic aspect may overcome their animal side."

The spiritual gifts which are within a child potentially can be used or misused, remain dormant or become developed. For example, a child's natural tendency for high energy, and desire to have more of everything, can be channelled to enthusiasm and purposefulness. But if it is mislabelled and criticized constantly, it can lead to greed and selfishness. Mislabelling children or name calling is one of the surest ways to give children a negative self-image. Besides, children tend to believe their parents words as the truth and they live up to those labels if they hear them often. We should try to speak to our children using the language of virtues. For example instead of saying to a child "you always fight with your friend and never listen to what I tell you." we can tell him "how can you make it up to your friend for forgetting to be peaceful."

To educate is "to bring forth" what already exists. Bahá'u'lláh says: "Regard man as a mine rich in gems of inestimable value. Education can, alone, cause it to reveal its treasures, and enable mankind to benefit therefrom." We as parents therefore, should value the God given gifts in our children and help them to develop their inherent potentialities. It is important to see each child as a unique individual and skilfully bring out the best in them.

#### In conclusion

"The child must not be oppressed or censured because it is undeveloped; it must be patiently trained." Every child has unique gifts and potentialities and as parents and teachers it is our sacred responsibility and privilege to educate the children intellectually and spiritually, support them to grow through life's many challenges and help them turn the tests in life into victories.

#### Swami's talk after the Navarathri Chariot Procession

I've never seen you all so exhausted! Even a fly could go for a tour in your mouth and you wouldn't know. What you've just done should energise you!

Just this morning I was talking, and I said, "For me, this is my greatest passion". This is what I live to do. My masters instruct me, and I come out and do it. Many of you don't understand this concept of master and disciple. It does "t only work on the material plane. It doesn't stop here.

Even after he leaves this material plane, your master will guide you, talk to you, and tell you where you are going. Your master teaches you the art of silence. Only your master can do that. Your master tells you when to act, when not to act, and how to react. But you must be in tune with your master.

Your guru will teach you the art or silence. The art of silence is the only thing that will take you through this journey. The art of silence lets you leave your issues behind. I'm only an instrument and this is my love. I'll give up anything for this.

Today I remember my first experience with my first guru, Narainsami. Before he accepted me as his disciple he chased me away three times. I was young, just fourteen years old. He chased my father too. His words were, "What rubbish! I'm no guru. I cut sugar cane! Who told you this rubbish? get out!"

He had a bottle of Mainstay, and a pork chop in his hand. He asked, "What's your problem?" My father told him that I had epilepsy and fits. My guru said, "Nonsense. He doesn't have epilepsy. Go home". Narainsamy was filthy, with fat dripping off his face from the chop. My dad said it wouldn't work. We go home, my mother holding the piece of paper for dear life. She put it in the water. I was outside, naked, and they poured a bucket of water over me. Then I came right. That's how Narainsami became my guru. And I held onto him for dear life, for ten, maybe twelve years. And then I met Jagadambal and left him to hold onto her.

What is it about women that leads them to behave in a way that men have trouble dealing with or performing?

I would guess our creator knew that women are involved in relationships and completeness while men are busy doing and perfecting. So naturally Eve tastes the fruit as any child would, who is told not to do something, while the parents are away. Out of that taste we learn we are mortal and naked. The latter is not a problem to cover up but the former is.

### **Today's Prescription for the Soul #362 – Surprises**


Even if it is a garden you know by heart there are twelve months in a year and every month means a different garden, and the discovery of things unexpected all the rest of the year. MARGERY FISH

Thought is the creative power, or the impelling force which causes the creative power to act; thinking in a Certain Way will bring riches to you, but you must not rely upon thought alone, paying no attention to personal action. That is the rock upon which many otherwise scientific metaphysical thinkers meet shipwreck - the failure to connect thought with personal action.

We have not yet reached the stage of development, even supposing such a stage to be possible, in which man can create directly from Formless Substance without nature's processes or the work of human hands; a man must not only think, but his personal action must supplement his thought.

By thought you can cause the gold in the hearts of the mountains to be impelled toward you, but it will not mine itself, refine itself, coin itself into double eagles, and come rolling along the roads seeking its way into your pocket.

Under the impelling power of the Supreme Spirit, men's affairs will be so ordered that someone will be led to mine the gold for you; other men's business transactions will be so directed that the gold will brought toward you, and you must so arrange your own business affairs that you may be able to receive it when it comes to you. ### The Initiation Process

ECKANKAR

Harold Klemp says in How to Survive Spiritually in Our Times, "Your ECK initiation can open the window of heaven. Your state of consciousness means nothing more than your state of acceptance." Each of us enters the path of Eckankar with a different state of consciousness. Our own level of unfoldment depends on our experience in this life and in previous incarnations. Some have studied the ECK teachings in past lives and therefore take to the path quite easily. For others it may be their first contact with the teachings of Light and Sound, and they may feel more comfortable proceeding slowly.

Beyond the First Initiation, which occurs in the dream state, initiations in ECK are given both physically and spiritually. The Living ECK Master authorizes each initiation. A letter is sent to the ECKist, which is an invitation to receive the initiation. The ECKist then makes an appointment with an ECK Initiator. The initiation takes less than an hour to complete, and includes instruction and contemplation. In some initiations, a new spiritual word is given, to be sung during spiritual exercises.

The pace of spiritual progress varies from person to person. A number of years normally pass between ECK initiations to ensure that each person has built strong spiritual foundations at each level. Some may experience their next initiation inwardly six months or more before they receive the outer invitation from the Master. For others, the significance of the initiation may not be fully understood for months after the initiation.

Each initiation corresponds to a different plane of existence. The Second Initiation is related to the Astral Plane, the Third to the Causal Plane, the Fourth to the Mental Plane, and so on. The Fifth Initiation is especially significant because it corresponds to the Soul Plane. This is the beginning of the pure spiritual worlds, above space and time. At the Fifth Plane the usual laws of karma and reincarnation no longer hold sway.

Consciousness has to be earned moment to moment. Of course, obtaining the Fifth Initiation in Eckankar does not guarantee spiritual balance or understanding. Consciousness always has to be earned moment to moment. Regardless of spiritual stature, a person can become confused, experience a spiritual setback, and have to start on the path again. The road becomes narrower as we move into the higher worlds. With greater spiritual freedom comes greater responsibility and accountability.

The rules change from plane to plane. The initiations of ECK can have a dramatic effect on our spiritual lives. If, as a Second Initiate, we become accustomed to operating on the Astral Plane, we may expect the rules and systems learned there to work for us everywhere. Many who take the Third Initiation are puzzled to find that the Causal Plane operates in a different manner. They must learn the new rules. This process constitutes part of our spiritual growth.

The real initiation occurs inside. Only the Mahanta, the Living ECK Master, can link up soul with the ECK through initiation. The outer initiation is simple and easy. As with many experiences in Eckankar, the real event occurs inside each of us. The outer initiation is a physical acknowledgment of the inner spiritual event. It is the inner event which makes all the difference.

### The Significance of the Star in the East BY PARAMAHANSA YOGANANDA

Following are excerpts from Discourse 3 of THE SECOND COMING OF CHRIST: The Resurrection of the Christ Within You, by Paramahansa Yogananda, which explore the deeper meaning of the "star in the east" - the spiritual eye seen in the concentrated state of meditation.

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The adoration of the Wise Men is far more significant than merely another scene of pageantry recognizing the holy birth. It was the defining stamp of God placed on the life of Jesus that would in future characterize his mission and message—a reminder that Jesus was born in the Orient, an Oriental Christ; and that his teachings bore the influence of the Eastern culture and customs. There is a very strong tradition in India, authoritatively known amongst high metaphysicians in tales well told and written in ancient manuscripts, that the wise men of the East who made their way to the infant Jesus in Bethlehem were, in fact, great sages of India. Not only did the Indian masters come to Jesus, but he reciprocated their visit. During the unaccounted-for years of Jesus' life-the Scripture remains silent about him from approximately age fourteen to thirty—he journeyed to India, probably traveling the wellestablished trade route that linked the Mediterranean with China and India. His own God-realization, reawakened and reinforced in the company of the masters and the spiritual environs of India, provided a background of the universality of truth from which he could preach a simple, open message comprehensible to the masses of his native country, yet with underlying meanings that would be appreciated in generations to come as the infancy of man's mind would mature in understanding....

As the prophets of the Old Testament foretold the coming of a Christ to be born in Bethlehem, so this major event of God's helping hand extended to man was foreknown also to the Wise Men with whom Christ's life and mission were to be linked....Whatever celestial star

might have indicated to the Wise Men the birth of Jesus, it was a "star in the east" of greater power by which they knew of the coming on earth of Christ Jesus: the all-revealing light of the spiritual eye of the soul's intuitive divine perception located in the "east" of the body—in a subtle spiritual center of Christ Consciousness in the forehead between the two physical eyes.

Man is veritably a microcosm of the macrocosmic universe. His finite consciousness is potentially infinite. While his physical sensory organs confine him to the world of matter, his soul is endowed with allpowerful instruments of perception by which God Himself may be known....

During meditative concentration at the point between the eyebrows, the spiritual eye can be seen: a brilliant white star in the center, encased within a sphere of sapphire-blue light, encircled by a radiant golden aura. The golden light is the epitome of the vibratory sphere of the Holy Ghost; the blue light is the omnipresent Intelligence of the Christ Consciousness; the star is the mystic door into the Cosmic Consciousness of God the Father.

Jesus said, "If therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light." Any devotee who, by the practice of yoga meditation, knows how to focus his inward gaze at the point between the eyebrows, finds that the light traveling through the optic nerves into the two physical eyes becomes concentrated instead into the single visible spiritual eye. The two physical eyes perceive only limited portions at



a time of the world of relativity; the vision of the spiritual eye is spherical and can see into omnipresence.

By deep meditation the devotee penetrates his consciousness and life force through the tricolored lights of the spiritual eye into the macrocosmic manifestation of the Trinity. When the Wise Men saw a star intimating to them the birth of Christ, they were beholding through the wisdom-star of infinite perception in their spiritual eye where the Christ Consciousness was newly manifested in the body of infant Jesus....

Spiritual signs appear on the body and face of one who is a realized soul; these signs are held secret, and only a few know how to read them. By these signs, and by their sight divine, the Wise Men were able to know they had found the Christ they sought, the babe who was one with the Lord of the Universe. They knelt and

offered their symbolic gifts. These were the traditional gifts given in India to the newborn; but they held further meaning coming from the Wise Men to Jesus: Gold (material treasure) is offered to a giver of wisdom as a symbol of appreciation of the great value of liberating truth bestowed by the spiritual teacher. Incense symbolizes devotion, the fragrance of the heart's love offered to the master who is a channel through whom God's guidance and blessings flow. The myrrh was in recognition of the bitter trial and sacrifice that would be required of Jesus in fulfilling his divine mission.

On a transcendent level of consciousness, in which others could neither participate nor bear witness, there was a spiritual exchange of soul-communion concerning the destiny of Jesus, which would be of universal benefit to man—as Jesus would be one of God's supreme message-bearers of Truth.
