





Pinpointing an English Genetic Homeland


- Can be more challenging!








- Clan MacGregor were outlawed after slaughtering members of Clan Colquhoun (and innocent spectators) at the Battle of Fruin Glen in 1603.
- In 1603 the MacGregor surname was proclaimed 'altogidder abolished" and bearing the MacGregor name was punishable by death (80 Clan members were named and outlawed).
- In 1604 The Chief of the MacGregor's and 30 Clansmen were executed in Edinburgh
- In the 1600's the first Valentine appears in Scotland.
- Ross Valentine matches the current chief of the MacGregor's in 35/37 markers!
- In 2007 The Clan Gregor Society of Scotland agreed to accepts into full membership of the Society individuals with ANY surname who can show, through DNA testing, that they have a DNA signature which matches, at the accepted degrees of mutational difference, that of the main MacGregor DNA signature.




The Future




