





A question on meditation

When I meditate, it is not easy to steadily concentrate because I am distracted by thoughts and memories or become passive and inattentive. Is it really necessary to always meditate with closed eyes to be superconscious?

Answered

It can be helpful to start meditation with firm resolve to be alertly attentive to what you do and experience. A brief prayer or invocation can be helpful. If meditation then flows easily, let it happen. If it does not flow easily, use a preferred technique or form of practice to keep your attention involved until it is not needed. Keeping your attention and awareness in the front and higher region of the brain can also help you to be alert and can keep attention removed from mental activities and subconscious inclinations.

If you are still inclined to be inattentive or passive, open your eyes and gaze straight ahead without looking at anything while maintaining an upright, poised, relaxed posture. If you are sometimes aware of random thoughts, memories, feelings, or sounds in the room, don't try to avoid, suppress, or analyze them. Be indifferent to them while remaining poised and still. With frequent, regular, alert practice, your mind will be calm and your awareness will be clear.

Qualities such as these lead to right relationships and the promotion of goodwill – these being the prime prerequisites to peace. In the Triangles work, the power of lighted thought contributes towards right relationships as consciousness is lifted to the soul.

The science of Triangles is founded on the recognition that all is energy with the physical form being the outer manifestation of the energy body – the etheric body which is an integral part of the etheric body of the planet and of the One Life – God. 

Gratitude and Generosity

Paramhansa Yogananda's guru, Swami Sri Yukteswar is quoted in *Autobiography of a Yogi* as making the statement, 'So long as you breathe the free air of earth, you are under obligation to render grateful service'. One naturally asks, why be grateful without reason? The 'air of earth' is simply there; it comes with living on this planet. Where then, is the need for gratitude?

The fact is, everything in the universe is consciously manifested, and with love. There is a consciousness which receives our gratitude and responds to it. Sri Yukteswar said that karmic law, though it functions to a great extent automatically, it is also guided by a universal intelligence and love, and can be intelligently diverted. Hence the concept of divine grace (kripa in Sanskrit). Grace can be won above all by devotion and love. The more a person gives generously of himself, to God and to life, the more karmic law supports him in return.

Is generosity always practical?

I received dramatic corroboration of the functioning of karmic law many years ago when certain people tried to undermine me by false accusations. Reflecting on Sri Yukteswar's counsel 'to render grateful service', it seemed to me that the only way to preserve my integrity was to respond with gratitude – if not to them, then to life for helping me to grow spiritually no matter how they treated me. I made up my mind, indeed, to respond not only with gratitude, but with love. In the years since, my firm adherence to Sri Yukteswar's teaching has brought me peace of mind, and a steady increase of inner joy. Moreover, I was able to accomplish all that my Guru told me to do.

In response to the later efforts of those same people to engineer my undoing by legal action, I wrote and published a little book called *Do It NOW*! which offers spiritual and practical sayings for every day of the year. Though Ananda Sangha's monetary needs were urgent, I felt inspired all the same to get this book read by as many people as possible. Therefore I decided to give it away free, and invested my own money for the printing of 5,000 copies, which were distributed free of charge.

Was it wise of me - and, indeed, was it practical – to be generous when our needs were so great? Some people might well consider my deed irresponsible. However, I knew I could reach 5,000 people directly – people who knew and appreciated what Ananda was doing. Therefore, I myself don't call it at all impractical! Indeed, I can add that something did work for us, for Ananda Sangha emerged from that struggle stronger than ever.

Always keep a generous attitude

In rendering 'grateful service', it is always good to be generous, yet one must be practical. That is to say, one should do what works, and one should also be generous within his means. What I want to say above all, then, is: keep a generous attitude even if you haven't the financial means to be generous in other, more material ways.

Usually, the first essentials for material success are a positive attitude and a strong will. I say 'usually', because people do strike it rich often enough, not because of their present mental attitude, but because they have strong money karma brought over from past lives. The following episode, which actually occurred, provides an amazing glimpse into the workings of karma, and the importance of a positive attitude and strong will power.

A certain gold prospector in America lived with his wife in a humble cabin in the mountains. For years he found only enough gold to 'keep the wolf from the door'. 

Psychic sleep – Part IV

Dear student, psychic sleep is not to gain any knowledge of the universe, but it is to enjoy the 'great pleasure' or 'spiritual bliss' which cannot be enjoyed by any other means. The astral traveler can wander all over the universe and study its structural qualities, but will not enjoy any great pleasure because he wanders with his mind and certain subtler faculties. When he returns he is unable to feel or enjoy the subtler radiations. Even the pleasures in paradise are enjoyed by the mind and not directly by the soul.

As in the physical world, the mind enjoys pain and pleasure of both hell and paradise. As a person suffering from coryza cannot experience fragrances, the mind and subtler bodies cannot feel the pleasure of the higher planes. It is to be felt and experienced directly by the soul itself. That is why I say that a psychic sleeper cannot explain any of his experiences enjoyed in that state. It is a higher pleasure which cannot be felt by mind.

If no new knowledge is gained by psychic sleep, then why should we practice it? Suppose you gain the knowledge of radio and TV repairs, but are not in a position to put them into use, what is the use of gaining that knowledge? The object of knowledge is to know correctly the manner of manipulating the art. Suppose you acquire the knowledge of preparing tasty sweets, but are unable to taste them. What, then, is the use of gaining that knowledge? Similarly, knowledge of the soul, the universe, and birth and death should be gained in order to enjoy the highest pleasure – *ananda* – bliss, which cannot be enjoyed by other means.

Religions, philosophies, and modern psychic and spiritual sciences teach the means and methods of enjoying such higher pleasures. But only very few, just one or two, put that knowledge into practice. All others waste their energy by simply reading and hearing or even learning higher sciences without using them practically.


Many seldom consider the reason for their birth, and why they lead this mostly challenging life. A few intelligent people have considered the phenomenon of existence, attempting to find an answer. After much study and contemplation of discourses by realised souls, yogis and siddhas, some have come to understand it is only by *sadhana* that one can attain everlasting bliss. And that this is the purpose of our birth, life and death. According to the law of evolution, after many lifetimes, even fools will eventually realise this and will begin *sadhana* to attain the ultimate goal.

In order to help one achieve permanent spiritual bliss, there are a few specific sadhanas which can undertaken. One such sadhana is *yoga nidra*. It has already been explained that in the state of *turiya* (yoga nidra), only the soul directly experiences the highest pleasure. The evolution of mind

The nature of the evolution of consciousness is always towards the source. This is sometimes referred to as the Creator, Oneness, God or the Supreme Being. Whatever the name, the word 'God' creates different perceptions and meanings in different minds. The essence of spirituality is to realise oneness with the Creator or Supreme intelligence. Within every thing, animate or inanimate, there appears to be and underlying intelligence which mirrors the intelligence of the cosmos.

Look into the eyes of an infant, and you may start to realise the presence of cosmic intelligence in all beings in the planet. However, societal values and dynamics often move human beings to a perception of relativity and separateness from the innate, pure cosmic intelligence inherent in every being in the planet. The idea of separateness from the whole or from Go,d has been the discussion point of many religions over thousands of years.

In the Vedic scriptures, separateness from the whole is described as *maya* or 'the illusory energy expression of God'. The playground of life, according to realised saints, is nothing more than a play of *maya*. Attachment to the 'play' will inevitably result in pain! A great saint echoed this view that we are all actors on the stage of life and that we should each play our part well. The question is: how do we continually realise that this is a stage or drama, and not absolute reality?

One method of acquiring the truth is the practice of mindfulness, or higher self-awareness. By continually 'catching' oneself while occupied with thoughts and behaviours that represent attachment, one is able to curb the impact of attachment. Higher self-awareness is important as it can prevent negative material karma from accruing to the doer. But the more effective way of detaching is through the practice of yoga and meditation. In meditation one is able to still the mind and slowly clear the subtle negative causative effects of attachment which, sooner or later, play out in action, word or thought.

Superconsciousness in its purest form destroys thousands of memories in the subconscious mind – memories which have a binding impact on spiritual aspirants. By consciously remaining still, slowing the breath, and achieving a state of oneness with the object of meditation, the meditator undergoes deep, subconscious mental transformation which purifies the mind and leads to beneficial choices for both self and all beings in the immediate vicinity. The spiritual aspirant then uses intuition to make moral choices which lead to evolutionary leaps on their own spiritual journey.

My message to you this month, dear readers, is to remain committed to spiritual progress via the practice of yoga and meditation. In addition, never stop practicing higher awareness and mindfulness in your daily actions as this will reduce the possibility of activating dangerous memories which lie dormant in the recesses of the mind!

Happiness and contentment

We often reflect about the true meaning of happiness and on how to attain lasting happiness and contentment in our lives.

"Happiness" according to the Bahá'í Writings "consists of two kinds; physical and spiritual. The physical happiness is limited; its utmost duration is one day, one month, one year. ... Spiritual happiness is eternal and unfathomable. This kind of happiness appeareth in one's soul with the love of God and suffereth one to attain to the virtues and perfections of the world of humanity".

Happiness is being filled with joy, peace, love and a sense of well-being. Joy is the inner sense that can carry us through the hard times. We all go through times of joy and sorrow. There is no one who is untouched by these two influences. But when we look for the reasons for our sadness, we see that the sorrow and the grief come from the world of matter. But the spiritual world imparts only joy. True and lasting joy is, therefore, closely related to spirituality.

According to the Bahá'í Writings: "...the trials which beset our every step, all our sorrow, pain, shame and grief, are born in the world of matter; whereas the spiritual Kingdom never causes sadness. A man living with his thoughts in this Kingdom knows perpetual joy. The ills all flesh is heir to do not pass him by, but they only touch the surface of his life, the depths are calm and serene... If material anxiety envelops you in a dark cloud, spiritual radiance lightens your path. Verily, those whose minds are illumined by the Spirit of the Most High have supreme consolation".

This is not to say that material needs and means are not important. Since the body is the instrument of the soul's development in this earthly life, physical health and development cannot be neglected. Material means are essential for humanity to be able to pursue its spiritual and other goals, as long as we use our material means towards the primary goal in life, which is fostering our soul's progress, and contributing towards the spiritual transformation of our societies.

Our spiritual side, referred to as soul, seeks to know and love; it is touched by awe and splendour, and holds to that which is eternal and good. It is our spiritual side that exhibits attributes such as truthfulness, courtesy, generosity, compassion, justice, love, and trustworthiness, which are essential for individual and social transformation and lead to lasting happiness.

True joy can be attained by means of praying and supplicating to God and by acting in accordance with God's teachings. The Bahá'í Scriptures state: "When one supplicates to his Lord, turns to Him and seeks bounty from His Ocean, this supplication brings light to his heart, illumination to his sight, life to his soul and exaltation to his being." "The spiritual man finds no delight in anything save in commemoration of God". "Prayer and meditation are very important factors in deepening the spiritual life of the individual, but with them must go also action and example, as these are the tangible results of the former".

Another source of spiritual joy, according to the Bahá'í Writings is service to others. Service gives meaning, purpose and stimulus to life. "...is there any deed in the world that would be nobler than service to the common good?" "...what pleasure can compare the pleasure of bringing joy and hope to other hearts. The more we make others happy the greater will be our own happiness and the deeper our sense of having served humanity".

The Bahá'í Faith is the youngest of the world's independent religions. Its founder, Bahá'u'lláh (1817-1892), is regarded by Bahá'ís as the most recent in the line of Messengers of God that stretches back beyond recorded time and that includes Abraham, Moses, Buddha, Krishna, Zoroaster, Christ and Muhammad.

Following the quote: Eknath Easwaren's Thought For The Day: When you discover that everyone is contained in you and you are contained in everyone, you have realized the unity of life, which is the divine ground of existence. Then you are not just a person; you have become a beneficial force. Wherever you go, wherever you live, those around you will benefit from your life. The life of such a person, such as Mahatma Gandhi in our own times, becomes a permanent, selfless force on this earth, because even after death his influence continues to bring people together, to make them aware of their trusteeship for the resources of the earth and for all creatures. Gandhi is still alive because he is still at work as a real force, advancing peace, good will, and unity.

Even one unassuming man or woman leading a selfless life, though he or she may live only a few years on earth, enriches all life for all time to come. Even if one person in a community is leading a selfless life, he will make his contribution, and she will slowly inspire others to make the same contribution, because human nature responds to such an example.

The following from Rabbi Benjamin Blech via Aish.com email. Judaism did not dwell on the obvious. Sure there is life after death; without it life would be rendered a transient flash in the pan, perhaps fun while it lasted but ultimately devoid of meaning. The Torah recorded the past as history; it chose to leave the future as mystery. What happens after death is that we gain the wisdom to evaluate our own life by the standards of Heaven–because we have finally glimpsed an eternal perspective.

Since our entry into the next world is preceded by the obligation for every one of us to watch the film record of our lives, what greater Hell can there be than for us to have to acknowledge our shameful actions and our unconscionable failings unto all eternity? And what greater Heaven can there be than the ability to look back forever on personal acts of goodness, of charity, and of noble and pious behavior that made us find favor in the eyes of God?

Perhaps it's best reflected in the following story. A very wealthy man not known for his piety stood in a long line of those waiting to have their lives assessed by the heavenly court. Be empty before God

The Earth is holy ground. An ancient Christian tradition sees nature as a second book of divine revelation. St Antony of the desert says his book 'is the nature of created things, and it is always at hand when I wish to read the words of God'. A saying in the apocryphal gospel of Thomas, 'split the stick and there is Jesus; lift the stone and one finds the Lord', invites us to feel, caress, stroke, hold, and cradle the very sticks and stones under our feet. He echoes a prayer of the divine office on the first Sunday of Advent, 'All the trees of the countryside clap their hands'. We must begin to notice the stick, the stone and the trees.

There are particular special spaces scattered throughout this holy ground we call the Earth. Space is not all the same. Some parts of space are qualitatively different from others. These spaces we call 'holy places'. We learn something of the origin of a holy place in the story of Jacob's dream. Jacob is on a journey to get away from his brother Esau, whose birthright he has stolen. On the way, something unexpected happens (Genesis 28.10–22): he lies down to sleep with a stone for a pillow and dreams of a mighty stairway between heaven and earth on which angels climb up and down. Right at the top he sees God who speaks to him and renews the promises he had already given to Abraham and Isaac. Jacob summarises his experience in the words, 'Truly, the Lord is in this place, and I did not know it' (Gen. 28.16). He is overcome with a holy fear: 'How awesome is this place! This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate to heaven'. So he takes the stone that he had put under his head and sets it up as an altar. This becomes the shrine of Bet-El. Jacob's encounter with God makes the place holy.

The bushveld, one of God's great gardens in Africa, leads us to a still point in ourselves. Herman Charles Bosman says that the soul of a culture must be indigenous, 'Its roots must be deeply entangled with the dark purple of the raw tissue of life that is at hand'.

The bushveld births in the soul a contemplative silence where nothing real is excluded. I am the restful presence I become when I allow the silence of the bushveld to touch me. When the creator on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel reaches out to touch Adam's hand, John Main sees the full flow of 'the divine current become earthed in Adam'. Adam lay still, and in the stillness received life. As I sit in silence, it is necessary to believe that the slightest aperture made in the wall of a closed spirit allows the love of God to enter and work wonders. On the spiritual journey it takes more energy to be still than to run.

Be silent. Be still. Alone. Empty before your God. Ask nothing. Be silent. Be still. Let your God look upon you. That is all. He knows. He understands. He loves you with an enormous love. He only wants to look upon you with his love. Quiet. Still be. Let your God love you.

If we find the courage to be still we will enter into a peace that is beyond all understanding. According to legend, St Kevin, who lived in the 'glen of two lakes' among the Wicklow Hills on the east coast of Ireland, moved a monster that lived in the smaller of the two lakes, and brought it to the upper lake where he lived. That is to say, he befriended the monster and brought it home with him. Since that time the lower lake has been known as a lake of healing.

We have to come face-to-face with our demons in order to overcome them. If we want to enter a place of solitude within ourselves, we must be prepared to accept ourselves totally, shadows and demons alike.



Michael Rogers talks of the failures, disappointments, resentments and hurts that lurk within. It is necessary to accept, forgive and befriend these uncomfortable parts of us. It can be a fierce struggle to let go and let be and accept the road we have travelled. Thomas Keating calms the water for us in his crystal clear observation that real stillness consists in the absence of self-concern. Real stillness is the peace of knowing oneself accepted by God as one is, and abandoning oneself to His love.

Truly I have set my soul in silence and peace. As a child has rest in its mother's arms Even so, my soul. PSALMS 131

Thomas Keating writes: 'Sometimes we need to sit with feelings instead of trying to get away from them... If we sit with painful emotions, name them, feel them and accept them... then we can stand down our feelings.

What we are embracing is not the suffering itself, but the God of love who dwells somehow at the bottom of them. In this way grace is released and healing begins. To sit with our suffering is one of the fastest ways to work through it. The radical healing is the acceptance of the situation because in some way God is present there. God always offers a way out. If we sit still we are more likely to see what it is... As soon as we accept the situation and forgive, the devil drops dead. The devil can thrive only on our refusal to love, and our unwillingness to forgive'. In silence, my spirit expands.
