# The Mission of Jesus



Peter and the apostles answered, "It's necessary to obey God rather than men. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, the One you killed by hanging him on a cross. God set him high at his side, Prince and Savior, to give Israel the gift of a changed life and sins forgiven. And we are witnesses to these things. The Holy Spirit, whom God gives to those who obey him, corroborates every detail."

#### Acts 5.29-32 The Message by Eugene Peterson

A speaker at a recent conference made the comment that an important decision was made at the first recorded assembly of believers which we hear about in Acts chapter 15. The church of Jesus Christ, according to the Spirit's direction in those days, was not going to be only *one*, *holy*, *cosmic* (*universal*, *catholic*) but *apostolic*. In other words, instead of just letting people in the world be whatever they were born into a belief system and circumstances to be, the truth about Jesus being raised from the dead was so compelling they were called to share it. Jesus as Lord of all commissioned them to go and spread the good news about Him for all the world. Thus, the church was by definition and new creation- apostolic (literally, "sent ones"). All followers of Jesus are sent into the world to tell the good news of Jesus which means repentance and forgiveness and new life for all who know it is "for them."

We need to keep being reminded by the Word of God and the Spirit about who the church is called to be. In the mission of Jesus, good news is the first order of our proclamation. Good works naturally follow. But as we hear just before the recorded text above, Peter and the apostles were being told by those of the old order before Christ not to teach or speak the good news. In fact, they were jailed for doing it.

So what did that apostolic bunch do? Did they just say, "Well, I guess they have a point. We'd better stop telling anyone about Jesus. People are okay with never hearing that truth." Their response was, "We must obey God rather than men [human beings]. We believe Jesus is raised from the dead and he has commissioned and sent us to tell it to everyone."

The church today is apostolic by very definition of God's call in Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit. We are called, gathered, enlightened and sanctified according to Martin Luther and the reformers sense of what the church is as the new creation. But we have realized of recent that we also have to add what Luther forgot to say in that list. We the church in the mission of Jesus are called, gathered, enlightened in the Gospel and sanctified but also "sent" in Jesus' name to a world in need of hearing the good news brought by Jesus in the flesh, crucified and risen from the dead (The Evangelizing Church, p. 64)

There is call here to obey God in Jesus and for the church to speak, risk beyond what culture wants to dictate and be the church which possesses the one truth that can truly set people free from sin. It is the "foolishness of our proclamation" by which God saves humans, not by our human wisdom or good efforts or anything else (1 Corinthians 1:21). The compassionate heart and service that accompanies such words does not replace speaking up about the Jesus we know to be God's Son and His Love.

We can be encouraged that we have been called, gathered, enlightened, sanctified and sent out as those first naïve disciples were. The church's call and identity is to be apostolic. "Admissibility to the faith is the ecumenical birthright of [hu]mankind, never to be superseded or curtailed" (Kenneth Cragg).

As a church in Vancouver, Washington, we could take a lesson from this first apostolic bunch who knew Jesus as Lord and dared to speak good news to others. As a church this next year, we hope to be looking for ways to be encouraged and provoked to think of the love of Christ as those first disciples understood the call. As something that has to be shared for the love of Christ for all.

It is going to be a growing, fun, challenging year of engagement with those near and far, local and global. And "the Holy Spirit will corroborate every detail" of truth as we engage God's world with good news! Pr Gary


