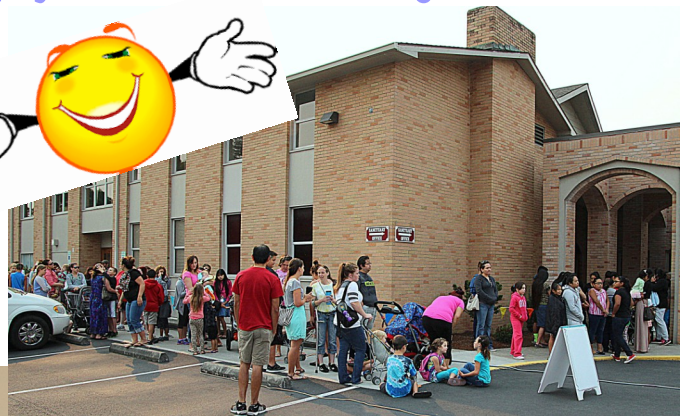
Still telling the story! That is our theme in glory, to tell the old, old story, of Jesus and his love!

Share's Summer SLAM Meal Program Addresses Big Need!



Trinity bit off a big bite when it agreed to serve lunches to children five days each week for the full seven-week duration of Share's program. That effort, under the auspices of the U.S. Dept. of Agriculture and oper-

ated locally by Share, addresses the absence of school meals for needy children during the summer vacation period. Because so many children ride busses to school, Share's approach is to take the food to locations where the kids can easily and safely go to receive the sack lunches. Lincoln Elementary School staff recommended that Trinity serve the lunches at Brickyard Park, a small neighborhood park on S. Lincoln Avenue between 31st and 32nd Streets.

Our worries about Trinity staffing the full schedule soon evaporated as our sign-up sheets quickly filled. Eight TLC members attended Share's mandated briefing session, studied for and successfully took the County's Food Handler exam, and were designated Site Supervisors at Brickyard Park! They were Jacque Bauman, Mike Baylous, Jack Johnson, Diane King, Ruth Larson, Doug Munson, Sue Pechacek and Jim Spence. Let's give them a hand for their accomplishments!

Serving on the 3-4 person teams were Diane Baylous, Wanda Bringman, Donna Ellingwood, Tammy Eshom, Debbie Huff, Nancy and David Haas, Jill Holm, Marilyn Johnson, Pastor Gary Larson and daughters Gracia and Marta, Shaun McAleer, Michelle McGill, Laurie Mudge, Patricia Running, Sande Spence, and Peggy Winston. Friends who also helped included Julie Scogan, Cheryl Monahan and Sherry Parker.

The USDA program targets children ages 1-18, and lunches have to be eaten on site. After the children are fed, any remaining lunches are available to adults. Most of the lunches were prepared at Covington Middle School and sent to the 21 local sites: all by Share volunteers. Periodically, Share would send bulk food (such as apples) and new children's books for the children to take home. Trinity purchased and used two 10'x10' canopies for sun protection—one over the food distribution tables and one over the park's lone picnic table. Much socializing took place among mothers and children around that one lone

table! Already, Share has asked Trinity to consider being a part of next year's program—maybe you'd be interested in helping. If so, have Dominique in the church office put your name on the list!

La Paz Mexico



It's been a long haul in La Paz, Mexico—

But Trinity has made a big difference in the lives of many children from two of the city's poorest areas. We still help provide a pre-school breakfast to the children of Colonia Marquez de Leon on a site adjacent to the simple Catholic Church. Tortillas, beans, fruit and vegetables are served to children for whom that might be their best meal of the day and also ensures that they do not have to go to school hungry. Mary and Mac Shroyer have been overseeing the program since its inception in 1999 when Trinity decided to lead a helping hand. One of their two sons lives here in Clark County, and Mac and Mary have taken to spending their summers here to escape La Paz' heat while connecting with family and with their friends here at Trinity.

Mary also serves on the Board of Directors of FANLAP, the local Children of La Paz Foundation headquartered in adjoining Colonia Laguna Azul. At its community center during the school year, 70 children on average eat breakfast twice weekly, and 180 on average eat lunch five days a week. Also, 180 are being helped with scholarships for tuition and transportation to continue on to junior and senior high schools. Many of those helped are girls who, because of difficult circumstances such as being single mothers, would find it nigh impossible to obtain further education and go on to become self-supporting. Holden Village is a year-round Christian retreat center in the Cascade Mountains, where adults and families celebrate, learn and serve. The village that looks like one in Switzerland, was built during the Howe Sound Copper Mining Company days. When the mining company closed in 1960 they donated the village to the Lutheran Church. The only way to reach the village is by boat to near the northern tip of Lake Chelan and up the road by a bus which takes you the 10 mile switchbacks to the village.

Over the years many people have found inspiration visiting Holden Village as guests for a week at a time, or as volunteers for longer periods. Today the village is **ONLY OPEN** to volunteers as the "tailings" left by the mining operation are being cleaned up with a **MAJOR** operation costing the current mine owners millions of dollars. Besides about 50 Holden volunteers, the village is currently full of hard working remediation workers blasting rocks, hauling rocks, digging trenches, planting trees etc. to return the area back to the beautiful forest it once was.

Holden has been closed to guests for over 2 years. They hoped to open the summer of 2016 but the remediation work is not yet completed and now they have had to temporarily evacuate the village due to fire danger that might close the road, the only escape route if needed.

Many Trinity folks have visited Holden over the years. Duane Lansverk was on the board for many years and he and Peggy had a recent opportunity in June to spend 5 hours at the village. The Village will return one day to continue providing inspiration in the wilderness. Watch this newsletter for any news.

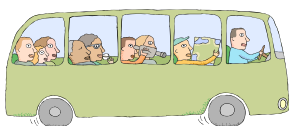


Happy Lunch Bunch


