## FUNERAL OF JAMES FUREY.

## Services at His Late Residence and a Réquiem Mass at St. Joseph's.

On Tuesday afternoon the remains of James Furey were interred at Flatbush. Funeral services were held at the family residence, 253 Prospeet place. They were followed by a requiem mass at St. Joseph's church on Pacific street, the following clergymen officiating: Father McGuire, celebrant; Father O'Grady, deacon, and Father Corcoran, sub deacon. The church was crowded during the celebration of the mass. Many floral tributes were placed around the casket and banked up over it, completely hiding it from view. They were principally from members of the immediate family of the deceased and lovingly marked "Grandpa," "Brother" and "Papa." There was also in extremely beautiful piece appropriately marred "Gates Ajar." The services at the house were conducted by Father Corceran, the pasto: of St. Joseph's church, of which Mr. Furey wata member, and the house was crowded with the relatives and the many friends of the deceasel and his family. Father Corcoran, in a touching allusion to the death of Mr. Furey, referred to him as a man of most exemplary character.
