

FUNERAL OF JAMES FUREY.

Services at His Late Residence and a Requiem Mass at St. Joseph's.

On Tuesday afternoon the remains of James Furey were interred at Flatbush. Funeral services were held at the family residence, 253 Prospect place. They were followed by a requiem mass at St. Joseph's church on Pacific street, the following clergymen officiating: Father McGuire, celebrant; Father O'Grady, deacon, and Father Corcoran, sub deacon. The church was crowded during the celebration of the mass. Many floral tributes were placed around the casket and banked up over it, completely hiding it from view. They were principally from members of the immediate family of the deceased and lovingly marked "Grandpa," "Brother" and "Papa." There was also an extremely beautiful piece appropriately marked "Gates Ajar." The services at the house were conducted by Father Corcoran, the pastor of St. Joseph's church, of which Mr. Furey was a member, and the house was crowded with the relatives and the many friends of the deceased and his family. Father Corcoran, in a touching allusion to the death of Mr. Furey, referred to him as a man of most exemplary character. Among those who attended the services were: Ex-Registrar Hugh McLaughlin, James Shevlin, James Murtha, ex-Mayor James Howell, James White, Water Purveyor Henry Hawkes, Aaron Midmels, Morris Fitzgerald, ex-Alderman Theophilus Olena, Senator John McCarty, Alderman McGarry, James Mulloy, John Mallon, M. McCarthy, ex-Alderman James Dunn, John McDermott, M. Pigott and Under Sheriff McLaughlin. At the time of his demise Mr. Furey was 56 years of age. He was engaged in the provision business in Fulton market, New York city, and few men had so large a circle of acquaintances. His brother, William A. Furey, is commissioner of jurory and another brother, Robert Furey, is exceedingly well known in Brooklyn. He never took any active part in politics, though distinction in the direction might have easily been commanded by his capacity and popularity. He leaves six children.
