

LACY VINE SCARF



There are a few ways to cast this scarf on depending on how you want the finished scarf to look. The center pattern is 26 stitches wide and will give you a wavy edge to your scarf. You can cast on an additional 5 (31 total stitches) stitches and work the parts of the chart that are shaded and that will give you straight edges. And for the full scarf I cast on an additional 8 stitches to accommodate a 3 stitch garter edging on both sides along with 1 slipped stitch on both sides to make the edges look neater (not shown in chart).

About the chart:

I am left handed and knit left handed. This is a universal chart but I did add things that may make it easier for other left handed knitters to read such as numbers up the left side (we knit left to right) and a legend for left handed knitters as our stitches lean the opposite direction as right handed knitters. The < and > point in the direction of the triple decreases.

For my scarf I used Caron Simply Soft and it took about 1 2/3 skeins. I knit it on size 8 needles.

Cast on as desired for portion of pattern you are knitting

For my scarf, with the garter edging, I did the 1st 3 rows in garter, slipping the 1st stitch.

All even numbered rows are purled. If you are working the full scarf with garter border and slipped stitch edge you will work the even rows as: slip1, k3, p26, k4

You can add 2 extra stitches how ever you decide to cast on and knit the last stitch than slip it purl wise on the next row.
