

Simple Knit Beanie

Yarn: Worsted weight

Needles: Size 8

This is a very simple beanie hat which is knit from the bottom up. This would be easy to make for any person of any size. Just add or subtract 10 stitches to the cast on row and extend the body till it's large enough for your use. I have made these for my sons, nephews and my Dad.

This particular hat was knit for my young son so I worked 6 sections meaning I cast on 60 stitches).

Cast on in multiples of 10 and join to knit in the round. Work 1 inch of 1x1 ribbing

Body:

repeat this one row until the body of the hat is long enough:

k9, p1

The crown:

Row 1: on each section purl the purls and ssk the 1st 2 stitches of the knit sections.

Row 2: On each section purl the purls and k2tog the last 2 stitches of the knit sections.

Continue these 2 rows until the crown is down to just 1k, and 1p per section (14 stitches for a 7 section hat) and cut the yarn, run thorough renaming live stitches to remove them from the needles and cinch the opening closed, secure and weave in ends.
