

Advancing Advance Care Planning in Colorado – Opportunities for Education and Updates

During 2010, the Colorado legislature and the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment made **major updates to the laws and regulations governing advance directives and advance care planning**: the Living Will statute was entirely repealed and re-enacted with significant changes; the CPR regulations were completed rewritten to conform more closely to the original statute; and the Medical Orders for Scope of Treatment program was launched.

The **Medical Orders for Scope of Treatment** is a new and highly effective method for identifying, documenting, and communicating preferences for medical treatment. A two-sided, one-page form, the **MOST documents key decisions** regarding CPR, general scope of treatment, antibiotics, and artificial nutrition and hydration. Intended for persons who are already seriously or chronically ill, it is completed in conversation with a healthcare professional. When signed by a physician, physician's assistant, or advanced practice nurse, the **MOST becomes a medical order set**, which can be followed in any healthcare setting. Research has proven MOST to increase advance care planning, documentation of preferences, and adherence to treatment choices while decreasing unwanted treatment and unnecessary confusion or conflict.

On August 23, Kip Boyd, MD, Chief Medical Officer, Mercy Regional Medical Center, and **Jennifer Ballentine**, **MA**, Executive Director of Life Quality Institute and co-chair of the Colorado Advance Directives Consortium, will offer three different educational opportunities to get up to speed on these changes.
