Through the Luminere Scholarship, individuals will be able to get help and learn about horsemanship from horsemen who have dedicated their lives to helping people and their horses.

The Luminere Scholarship fund promotes the future of the horse industry by supporting dedicated individuals who will give back and contribute to their fellow horsemen and their community.

Application Process (Deviation from this process will result in disqualification.):

1. Applicants will complete the attached application and mail to:

2. All applications must be postmarked no later than **April 17th 2019**.
3. Applications will proceed to a six-person committee where they will be anonymously evaluated based on predetermined criteria. If the committee determines that the applicant be awarded a scholarship, an amount will be determined.
4. Applicants will be notified via mail of acceptance or denial of the scholarship application.
5. Recipients are expected to write a follow-up Reflection to the scholarship committee noting the value of the experience for you and your horse.
6. The Luminere Scholarship Fund is a formal application process; written, printed or typed applications are acceptable. Neatness and grammar are valued.
7. All scholarships are non-transferable; specific to person and event requested in application. Any changes must be approved by the Luminere Committee.
8. Stock Horse of Wisconsin does not discriminate, and all applications will be considered.
9. Scholarships must be used within the year awarded and cannot be carried over to the following year. Exceptions will require approval but will be made under special circumstances.
10. Exceptions will be made under special circumstances.
11. All applications will remain confidential to the Luminere Committee and will not be shared with others outside of the committee.
