# Parallels between Jonah Chapter 1 and the Gospels

- Jonah 1:1 Now the word of the LORD came unto Jonah the son of Amittai, saying,
- 2 Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and cry against it; for their wickedness is come up before me.
- 3 But Jonah rose up to flee unto Tarshish from the presence of the LORD, and went down to Joppa; and he found a ship going to Tarshish: so he paid the fare thereof, and went down into it, to go with them unto Tarshish from the presence of the LORD.
- 4 But the LORD sent out a great wind into the sea, and there was <u>a mighty tempest in the sea</u>, so that the ship was like to be broken.
- 5 Then the mariners were afraid, and cried every man unto his god, and cast forth the wares that were in the ship into the sea, to lighten it of them. But Jonah was gone down into the sides of the ship; and he lay, and was fast asleep.
- 6 So the shipmaster came to him, and said unto him, What meanest thou, O sleeper? arise, call upon thy God, if so be that God will think upon us, that we perish not.
- 7 And they said every one to his fellow, Come, and let us cast lots, that we may know for whose cause this evil is upon us. So they cast lots, and the lot fell upon Jonah.
- 8 Then said they unto him, Tell us, we pray thee, for whose cause this evil is upon us; What is thine occupation? and whence comest thou? what is thy country? and of what people art thou?
- 9 And he said unto them, <u>I am an Hebrew; and I fear the LORD</u>, the God of heaven, which hath made the sea and the dry land.
- 10 Then were the men exceedingly afraid, and said unto him, Why hast thou done this? For the men knew that he fled from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them.
- 11 Then said they unto him, What shall we do unto thee, that the sea may be calm unto us? for the sea wrought, and was tempestuous.
- 12 And he said unto them, Take me up, and cast me forth into the sea; so shall the sea be calm unto you: for I know that for my sake this great tempest is upon you.
- 13 Nevertheless the men rowed hard to bring it to the land; but they could not: for the sea wrought, and was tempestuous against them.
- 14 Wherefore they cried unto the LORD, and said, We beseech thee, <u>O LORD</u>, we beseech thee, <u>let</u> us not perish for this man's life, and lay not upon us innocent blood: for thou, O LORD, hast done as it pleased thee.
- 15 So they took up Jonah, and cast him forth into the sea: and the sea ceased from her raging.
- 16 Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and offered a sacrifice unto the LORD, and made vows.
- 17 Now the LORD had prepared a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

#### The Storm

Acts 4:25 it is you who said by the Holy Spirit through our ancestor David, your servant: 'Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples imagine vain things? v.26 The kings of the earth took their stand, and the rulers have gathered together against the Lord and against his Messiah. v.27 For in this city, in fact, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, gathered together against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed, v.28 to do whatever your hand and your plan had predestined to take place.

#### Lighten the Ship

Mark 15:15 So <u>Pilate</u>, <u>wishing to satisfy the crowd, released</u> <u>Barabbas for them</u>; and after flogging Jesus, he handed him over to be crucified.

#### The Rest of Faith

Ma.27:13 Then said Pilate unto him, <u>Hearest thou not how many</u> things they witness against thee? 14 And he answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly.

#### Questions

John 18:35 Pilate answered, Am I a Jew? Thine own nation and the chief priests have delivered thee unto me: what hast thou done?

#### His IdentityRevealed

John 19:7 The Jews answered him, We have a law, and by our law he ought to die, because he made himself the Son of God. 8 When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he was the more afraid; 9 And went again into the judgment hall, and saith unto Jesus, Whence art thou? But Jesus gave him no answer.

### Rowing Against the Storm

Luke 23:20 Pilate therefore, willing to release Jesus, spake again to them. 21 But they cried, saying Crucify him, crucify him. 22 And he said unto them the third time, Why, what evil hath he done? I have found no cause of death in him: Iwill therefore chastise him, and let him go. John 19:12 And from thenceforth Pilate sought to release him: but the Jews cried out, saying, If thou let this man go, thou art not Caesar's friend: whosoever maketh himself a king speaketh against Caesar.

#### The Storm Grows Worse

Mat 27:23 Then he asked, "Why, what evil has he done?" But they shouted all the more, "Let him be crucified!"

Luke 23:23 And they were instant with loud voices, requiring that he might be crucified. And the voices of them and of the chief priests prevailed.

## Lay Not Upon Us

Mat 27:24 So when Pilate saw that he could do nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took some water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, "I am innocent of this man's blood; see to it yourselves."

#### Cast Into the Sea

John 19:16 Then delivered he him therefore unto them to be crucified. And they took Jesus, and led him away.
