


- Vivid Verbs (rushed, meandered, not went)

- Image-driven Adjectives (lichen-smothered stone walls; a droll smile creased his face)
- Similes, metaphors, personification
- Onomatopoeia, alliteration

Discard Crutch Words

- "To Be" Verbs (am, is, was, were, has been, became)
- Helping Verbs (might, may, should, have, must, has, can, did, will)
- Vague Adverbs (always, sometimes, very, slowly, proudly)





Bench Tired Words

- Overused Adjectives (awesome, interesting, great)
- "He said, she said."
- Vague, Non-specific Nouns (somewhere, thing)
- Overused Pronouns (it, they)
- Clichés (slow as molasses)
