Dear Mr. Serry,

RE: Israeli-Palestinian conflict and more

It is hopeful that the UN pays such a big attention to the solution of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. However the proposed two-state solution of the conflict is hardly achievable, judging by the situation on the ground and the long history of failed attempts in this respect. Scientifically, it is only the one-state solution that would be possible and moreover favorable in many respects. But such a solution would require a thorough reform of both the Israeli and Palestinian societies, because of deep roots of the conflict. That prospect may seem perhaps less frightening taking into account that the I-P conflict is just a particular manifestation of the present general ideological crisis of civilization and would be treated in the framework of the general reform of modern society.

As to the above general crisis, underlying it, as an analysis shows, is the crisis of modern science. Thus to overcome that general crisis, it would be necessary to reform modern science and education, which is certainly quite a task in itself. Fortunately, during my independent research in exact sciences and humanities, I have started such a reform and developed a general methodology for it. Now it is clear that such a fateful endeavor cannot hinge long on the enthusiasm of a pensioner, but needs a wide international support and cooperation, first of all on the part of UNESCO.

In this connection would you please take measures either to open in UNESCO a new department aimed at reforming modern science under my direction, or to upgrade my currently virtual organization, THE REFORM SCIENCE CENTER (www.reformscience.org), to a full-fledged international organization under the auspices of UNESCO, set up possibly in Europe, otherwise in Israel. With the new science and education, in social and political fields in particular, the I-P conflict, as well as the other Middle East conflicts, would be easily settled. Please find enclosed additional information on the matter.
