## From the Exec

The Executive met on the 13th December.

The following committee convenors were confirmed:

Finance Audit and Risk: Baubre Murray Player Development: Phillip Drew

Laws: Brian Boutel

Organisation Development: Annie Henry

We have repeatedly advised the potential loss of investment in Croquet by SportNZ over the last 12 months. This investment was due to expire at 30 June 2015 with SportNZ putting a new Community Sport strategy in place - with an increased focus on youth.

However, when SportNZ put out their draft strategy for consultation from stakeholders, there were over 60 replies from affected organisations (including ourselves) querying various aspects. Considering the feedback and "re-shaping" their strategy took longer than they expected which means there is not enough time before 30 June 2015 to determine investment criteria, assess stakeholder applications against the new criteria and develop an investment framework. So they have had to rollover all stakeholders funding for 12 months until 30 June 2016. Therefore, Croquet NZ will continue to receive Community Sport Investment for another 12 months. That is the good news.

The bad news for Croquet is that the investment from this source will become more "contestable". In our experience the practical application of this is that large sports get more and smaller sports (like ourselves) get less/nothing. The Executive Director and Sport Development Officer have an enormous task ahead of them to convince SportNZ of Croquet's "value proposition in the Community Sport space".

If, over the next 6-9 months (as they put together our proposal), they ask you for assistance on this proposal, please provide any help you can.

## Wellington Croquet Association

#### Khandallah Croquet Club turns 100

Sunday 16 November 2014 was a stunning day for the centennial celebration of the Khandallah Croquet Club in Woodmancote Road, Wellington. Current and former members of the club mixed on the green with members of the Onslow Historical Society, before a function at the Khandallah Bowling Club next door. Croquet Club members had decorated the venue with ikebana floral arrangements and a historical display that included Edwardian croquet outfits - far too slender for any current member!

The venue was fitting, because the Bowling Club stands on the site of the private croquet green of the former Woodmancote homestead, which was owned by the Izard family until it was demolished in 1910. The ladies who subsequently formed the Croquet Club were the wives and daughters of the bowlers. It is likely that the privileged and extrovert Keith Izard played here as a child. He went on to be a champion croquet player in England before becoming the first NZ Open Champion in 1913.

The President of the Croquet Club, Gaylia Powell, welcomed about 100 guests, including Hon Chris Finlayson, Hon Peter Dunne, and Her Worship the Mayor of Wellington, Celia Wade-Brown. Baubré Murray spoke on behalf of Croquet New Zealand and presented the club with a congratulatory certificate. Alison Robinson, Vice President of the Wellington Croquet Association, spoke about how, as the previous Tournament Convenor, she had scheduled as many golf croquet inter-club matches as she could at Khandallah, so that players from other clubs could discover it as she had!

The occasion celebrated the launch of a 60-page history, researched and written by a six-person subcommittee. The book covers the themes of developing and maintaining the club, set in the historical, social and economic context of the area. Gaylia said that it was remarkable that this little club with its single green had survived the challenges of fluctuating membership, maintaining the court, and financial pressure. With the property owned by the Croquet Club and not the City Council, members are responsible for its upkeep and pay rates. However, with 35 members, it is in good heart, and looking ahead with confidence.

The Club's Patron, Lorraine Murrie, grand-daughter of a founding member, launched the book, and then guests enjoyed a fabulous old-fashioned "dainty" afternoon tea, including lamingtons, cucumber sandwiches, and lemon tarts. A fruit cake had been beautifully decorated by Tamiya Rowlands, a Weltec patisserie student, and was cut by 94 year-old Aline Clarke, a former member and neighbour of the Croquet Club. The afternoon ended with the Mayor drawing the raffle – a favourite fund-raiser through the century.

This little poem read out at the function is by A.R.D. Fairburn, from an anthology published by Pegasus Press, Christchurch, and titled "The Hon Mrs Tweedscantie", 1966.

Her bridge? Gad, sir, rotten. Her golf? best forgotten. Her fishing? Well, frantic. Her hunting? An antic. Her shooting? Oh nervy. Her archery? Scurvy. Her billiards? Just pokey -But crikey, her croquet!

Golf Croquet Handicap doubles were played on day three with Sally Cole and Susan McKessar (Carlton) the winners, and Joeline and Jeff Sunderland (Howick) runners up; Geoff Young (Kereone) won the Open Championship Singles with Sabri Mullaaliu (Mt Albert) runner up.

The Open Singles had a very good field with eight entrants with handicaps ranging from zero to three. Most were competing for a spot in the World Championships to be held early next year. Four people tied for runner up with nine games won so Sabri came second on countback.

Overall, some excellent croquet was played.

We also have a very enthusiastic band of Golf players who thoroughly enjoy their Club Days although they do not seem to want to partake in competitions outside the district. We are hoping to maintain this momentum and increase our membership. However, as we all know that is not easy. So if anyone has any ideas please let us know.

Maybe we will need to follow the possible footsteps of Wellington and become a *Super Croquet Association!!!* Perish the thought.

## AWAMOA CROQUET CLUB, OAMARU 90th ANNIVERSARY

It was on the 24 May 1924 that a meeting was held in the Junction Hotel, Oamaru for the purpose of forming a croquet club. It was chaired by the Mayor, Mr J. McDiarmid and the twenty-five ladies present all enrolled as members of the Awamoa Croquet Club. The

subscription for the first year was set at one guinea and membership was restricted to 65.

The Awamoa Bowling Club offered surplus ground for the greens, but until this was prepared the Borough Council gave permission to use part of the lawn adjacent to the band rotunda in the Public Gardens. So on 22 November that year play commenced on two afternoons a week excluding Saturdays and Sundays.

On 24 February the following year, the lawns at Awamoa were officially opened – one large and two smaller ones. Previously the area had been a lagoon with a rowing boat moored on it and for many years the lawns would be submerged after heavy rain.

At first members had to teach themselves the game by trial and error consequently matches with other clubs proved that there was much to be learned! Members sometimes travelled to Timaru by chartered bus twice a week to play teams from Timaru, Temuka and Ashburton – the day's outing costing five shillings!

The closure of the Gardens Club resulted in amalgamation with us and on 5 February 2011 The Awamoa Gardens Croquet Club was officially formed and on 2 January 2014 two new lawns were opened making a total of five lawns. We had been working towards this for a few years as with the popularity of golf croquet the existing three lawns were becoming overcrowded on club days.

Much has been achieved by the Awamoa Croquet Club in its 90 years and we gathered to celebrate this on 16 and 17 November. An afternoon tea was held on the Sunday which was attended by life and past members as well as representatives of the other clubs in South Canterbury and Forbury Club in Dunedin and our new flag was raised. Sixty players participated in our Fun Day on the Monday which brought to a close the anniversary celebrations.
