Dear Mr. President:

RE: project and appeal for support I am an independent researcher, PhD, an Israeli citizen, currently a pensioner, 79. I appeal to you for support of my project vital for the destiny of civilization, for the destiny of the Jewish people, in particular. I appeal to you because of your great political power and progressive outlook.

The project is based on my life-long research in exact sciences and humanities and provides for the establishing in Israel of AN INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC CENTER aimed at reforming modern science, philosophy and religion, the spheres responsible for the ideology of modern society. Such a reform is necessary to settle the present general ideological crisis of civilization now threatening the very existence of humankind and manifesting itself most acutely perhaps in the Middle East.

In Israel, the urgency of the above reform is emphasized by the sharp escalation of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, the UN recognition of the Palestinian statehood, the Palestinian threat to apply to the ICC, as well as by the recent mass protests against the Jewish state bill, all that against the background of the unclear nuclear status of Israel and its increasing isolation on the international arena.

Scientifically and as a matter of fact, THE ONE-STATE SOLUTION is the only way to settling the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. But that would require a radical reform of ideology of both societies. Thus, if Israel is seriously concerned about the security of the Jewish people, it should abandon its current Zionist dream and adopt the scientific approach to the problem. With such a reform, Israel would have recognizable geographical borders, a constitution, real peace and security and the respectable international status, while preserving the best features of the Jewish culture. Moreover, with the proper development of that mission, Israel would turn into the scientific and ideological center of the Middle East.

Although the above reform is quite a task in itself, fortunately, in the course of my independent research, I have already started the reform of science, developed the proper methodology for it, reformed theoretical physics and created the frameworks of the sciences of politics and economics, the sciences nonexistent before and socially most important. If recognized, those achievements would signify a turning point in the history of science and civilization. However, because of the present monstrous crisis of science and its institutions, those achievements have not been recognized officially yet. Moreover, there seems to be a kind of conspiracy against me initiated by Russian agents.

To proceed with the reform and attract researchers, I have launched a website, <u>www.reformscience.org</u>, and applied for support to various organizations and UNESCO, but in vain. To establish the above scientific Center, it would be enough perhaps to set up an NGO for 7-10 persons or so and organize its work properly. There are numerous scientific funds and philanthropic organizations in Israel, Europe and the USA that, with your patronage and recommendations, would provide the necessary financial support and sponsorship for that mission. My first task would be to organize the proper functioning of the Center and prepare younger researchers to substitute me when necessary. To run the Center, I would need the proper living conditions instead of my current hostel in Haifa.

In this connection would you please consider my above project and appeal for assistance. The relevant papers are enclosed.
