



Chart 21. Family Income Distributions of Financial Aid Recipients at Cal U. These data show that the family income data for Cal U students shifted substantially between 2002 and 2011. The percentage of students from families with incomes over \$100,000 per year almost tripled (2.86) during that time. The percentage of students from families making between \$70,000 and \$99,999 grew by 21%. At the same time, the percentage of students from families making between \$40,000 and \$69,999 fell by 22%. And the percentage of students from families making less than \$40,000 fell by 13%. These data demonstrate a huge shift to students from wealthier families.
