A GENTLE PILGRIMAGE

Would you be interested in joining a short break pilgrimage with McCabe Travel visiting Edinburgh, the Border Abbeys of Jedburgh, Dryburgh and Melrose, together with visits to Rosslyn Chapel, Inchcolm Island and Dunfermline Abbey in June of next year.

This will be a new venture for McCabe and will be led by a minister who has served his ministry in the borders. It will run from 26 – 30 June 2017 and will cost £525. As always with McCabe this covers accommodation, (in Pollock Halls -University Halls near the centre of Edinburgh), breakfasts, dinners, lunches, fees, gratuities, guiding, coach and ferry. It does not cover the cost of getting to Edinburgh, there is car parking with the accommodation, though we are looking to travel by train.

The Gospel Reading

Luke 13: 10–17

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke GLORY TO YOU, O LORD.

Now he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, 'Woman, you are set free from your ailment.' When he laid his hands on her, immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, 'There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day.' But the Lord answered him and said, 'You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath until his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.
