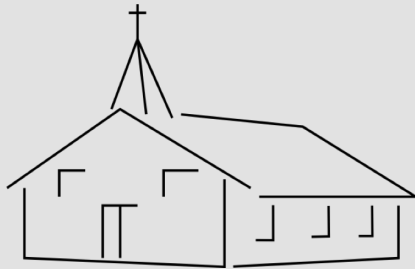


Building to Gather, Grow, and Go



After 11+ years of using multiple locations and outgrowing them all, Westlake Lausanne is planning to lay down a foundation by investing in a permanent home.

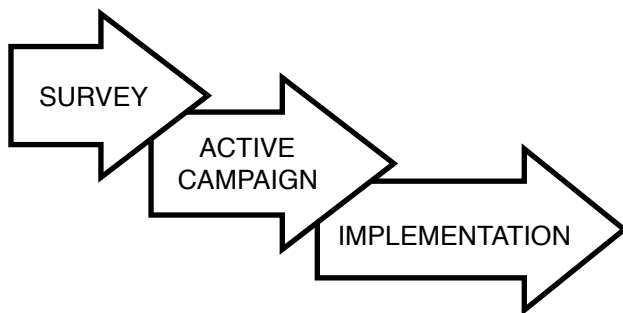


What is a Capital Campaign?

A Capital Campaign is an intensive effort to raise money for a specific purpose, in this case a Church Building that we can buy or build.

How will the Capital Campaign work?

There are 3 stages, during which we will work together to see what we can do and then do it, trusting God to provide for us and lead us at each stage.



Survey

Like all good projects, the Capital Campaign begins with good planning. During this phase we need to answer a number of questions. The most important is: What is a realistic target figure that we can raise? This will then help us further define the project.

However, during the survey phase, we will also be praying for the project and seeking God as to what each of us feel he is calling

us to give. So, please add the Capital Campaign to your regular prayer list.

This phase will run from mid-May through June 2017.

Active Campaign

The fund-raising target that we determine from the first phase will allow us to develop a more concrete project to use in the second phase, in which we will actively seek pledges of financial gifts that people commit to give to this project. These will come from our existing church family, alumni, friends and foundations.

This phase will run from mid-September through November 2017.

Implementation

Once we know how much finance is firmly committed to the project, we will begin the implementation phase. This may mean buying land, employing an architect, and starting to build or renovate. At the beginning of this phase the pledges will be collected.

It is not possible at this point to say how long the implementation phase will take: it will depend on the nature of the final project.



The entire process will be long in duration, and we need to stay focused on the real reason why we are investing in a Church home: to glorify God and see His mission on earth extended through the gospel.
