Proceedings of the Ironwood City Commission Meeting

A Regular Meeting of the Ironwood City Commission was held on August 28, 2017 at 5:30 P.M. along with a Public Hearing at 5:25 P.M. in the City Commission Chambers, Second Floor of the Municipal Memorial Building in the City of Ironwood.

- 1. Mayor Burchell called the public hearing to order at 5:25 P.M.
- 2. Recording of the Roll.

R. Manager's Report.

City Manager Scott B. Erickson verbally gave the manager's report noting the following items:

- *The City wide cleanup day has been scheduled for Saturday, October 7th.
- *The DPW crew is completing the installation of approximately 330 lineal feet of 6-inch water main on Francis Street just west of Broadway.
- *The DPW crew will be removing several dead trees in Longyear Park.
- *Spot milling will take place along McLeod Avenue between Lowell Street and Silver Street.
- *The next "First Friday" event in the downtown will be held on Friday, September 1, 2017.
- *The Little League group continues construction on the new concession stand at the Little League Field.
- *The MDOT's contractor, Northwood's Paving, will be milling and overlaying Business Route 2 after the Labor Day Holiday. There will be night paving along the BR to minimize disruptions to the downtown traffic.
- *There will be a City Commission workshop prior to the next City Commission meeting (September 11th, 2017 at 4:45 p.m.) to review Coleman Engineering's results of the two yearlong SAW (Sanitary and Storm) study which is currently being finalized.
- *Snow Country Contracting has been awarded contracts for the demolition of 5 blighted residential structures.
- *Nasi Construction is wrapping with a vinyl coated metal the exterior of the large stain glass window at the Ironwood Memorial Building.
- *The auditors will be starting their preliminary work in preparation to start the City's audit.
- *Applications are being received until Thursday, August 31, 2017 for the Public Safety Director position and Friday, September 15, 2017 for the Deputy City Clerk's position.
