Tom was the eldest of five children born to Eugene Carr and Anne Haney in Pittsburgh, PA. His two brothers, James and John, predeceased him and he is survived by his two sisters, Lois Ann and Patricia.


He met his future wife, Marie, at Bucknell University in 1946. They married in 1950 and raised four fine children, Thomas Jr. (Julie), Richard (Kathy), Robert (Andrea), and Nancy (Daniel) who gave them seven grandchildren, Christina (Aaron), Katharine, Monica (Oscar), Jennifer (Jeremy), Rebekah, Ian (Ramsay), and Rose. Tom was accepted as a Naval Air Cadet in 1944 and began studies at Bucknell University that eventually led to his becoming an electrical engineer with a significant career in the aerospace industry from 1949 to 1986. Working at Arma, he contributed to many defense projects. As an early computer expert, he developed guidance systems for the country's first ICBM, and invented the computer screens and input consoles that filled the Houston Mission Control Room for the Apollo program. During his years with The Aerospace Corporation, he worked closely with the Air Force and managed many projects including "the Blue Cube" satellite control center, the first GPS Satellites, and the MILSTAR program which produced the defense satellite system that still guards the U.S. to this day.

He worked in New York until moving to Palos Verdes in 1964. He enjoyed 33 years of retirement devoting much time and energy to his family and many hobbies - including painting, woodworking, car repair, home maintenance, skiing, backpacking and travel - until his loss of eyesight and hearing hampered his activities.
