

EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

The South Shore Board of Education believes that innovation and change in education - both content and methods - are necessary for meeting the changing needs of youth as they face life before them. The acquisition and application of knowledge is the one goal that remains steadfast in an ever-changing world.

The Board further believes that:

- a. The education process should develop a feeling of self-worth and accomplishment in each student. It should also help each student develop habits, attitudes, understanding and skills necessary to lead a productive, satisfying life in civilized society.
- b. Each child should be helped to understand the duties and privileges of responsible citizenship as it relates to him or her as an individual and to the world community.
- c. Equal educational opportunity is the right of all children without regard to sex, race, color, religion, national origin, ancestry, creed, age, pregnancy, marital status or parental status, sexual orientation, gender identity, physical, mental, emotional, or learning disability, or other basis prohibited under state or federal law.
- d. The advice and support of citizens of the community, and especially the professional staff should be encouraged as the district endeavors to develop the attitudes and abilities demanded in today's society.
