Love your Burial Ground Week

Communities are being encouraged to come together to discover and protect the wildlife in their local churchyards as part of the *Churches Count on Nature* initiative which will run together with Love Your Burial Ground Week from Saturday 5 – Sunday 13 June.

Churches are being asked to use the week as a springboard to start recording the wildlife within their churchyards. Communities and visitors should make a note of the animals, birds, insects, or fungi in their local churchyard. This data will then be collated on the National

Biodiversity Network. It is being jointly run by the conservation charities Caring for God's Acre, A Rocha UK, the Church of England, and the Church in Wales.

Church land, often uniquely unploughed and undeveloped, could be a habitat for precious and endangered plants and other wildlife. The week is open to anyone with a love of nature and churches are encouraged to link with local schools, wildlife groups, and those who may not have visited before to discover churchyards.

Over time, Home for Good: Worcestershire has been highly effective at forging strong links between churches and the fostering and adoption services across Worcestershire.



Worcestershire Children First's fostering service has experienced a rise in need for foster families during the pandemic, and has also seen greater numbers of carers retire. They are aware that Christian carers are more likely to commit to fostering over a long period and more willing to take in the children and young people who are in the most need.

This Fathers' Day, churches across the county have been invited to share a short video, produced by Home for Good, featuring male Christian foster-carers sharing their positive experiences. The video will celebrate and encourage men, as well as women and couples, either to step into the breach as carers or adopters, or simply to support others.

The pandemic in Morogoro

Sunday 27 JUNE

In the Diocese of Morogoro, Tanzania, the first Covid–19 case was reported in March 2020 and numbers have steadily climbed. Many people's livelihoods have been badly affected by the pandemic in Tanzania. Farmers have struggled to trade across borders; many school staff have not been

paid; and the growth of the large tourism and hospitality industry has been derailed. Hospital doctors have been forbidden from referring to the disease in public, though there has been a marked increase in admissions of patients exhibiting Covid–19 symptoms.

The World Health Organisation (WHO) is deeply concerned about the situation. However, the new President, Mama Samia Suluhu Hasan, has recently formed a committee of experts to evaluate the nation's Covid–19 response. It is hoped that the new regime will uphold the WHO standards in combatting the pandemic. Furthermore, that it will increase funding to church health facilities, which are currently struggling to implement mass testing, as well as the tracking and tracing of cases.
