1	Resolution in Opposition to U.S. Sanctions on Cuba
2	
3	Whereas, starting in 1960, the U.S. has imposed an increasingly severe economic,
4	commercial and financial embargo on Cuba, which was intensified by Donald Trump in
5	2017; and
6	
7	Whereas, the U.S. blockade often prevents the purchase of necessary educational
8	materials, desks, books, technology which are essential for the teaching-learning process
9	and even basic resources for building repairs in the schools; and
10	
11	Whereas, the U.S. blockade has severely restricted collaboration on scientific and
12	medical research that interferes with the potential of saving lives in the face of this
13	pandemic <sup>1</sup> , including Cuba's development of four vaccines against Covid-19; and
14	
15	Whereas, the Professional Staff Congress is an academic union at the City University of
16	New York, a university with the most diverse student body in the U.S., which has
17	educational exchange and solidarity programs with Cuba, restrictions on travel and
18	exchange harm our students and faculty, as well as U.S. and Cuban faculty and students
19	more broadly; and
20	
21	Whereas, the PSC has worked against U.S. unilateral sanctions since 2018; and
22	
23	Whereas, for 29 consecutive years the General Assembly of the United Nations has voted
24	overwhelmingly to adopt a resolution in favor of lifting the U.S. embargo against Cuba <sup>2</sup> ;
25	and
26	
27	Whereas, despite punishing sanctions, Cuba is a country that prioritizes education and
28	spends 13% of its GDP on universal public education, the highest of any nation <sup>3</sup> ; and
29	
30	Whereas, current U.S. policy undermines the solidarity that Cuba has shown with
31	oppressed communities globally and in the U.S.; and
32	
33	Whereas, Cuba is providing free medical education to low-income students in the U.S.,
34	particularly students of color in underserved communities who are unable to afford
35	medical school <sup>4</sup> ; and

Whereas, Cuba has a long history of providing international medical aid and healthcare to the peoples of the world, and the Henry Reeve International Brigades were decisive in the fight against Ebola and have stepped forward in many epidemics around the world, including dengue fever, HIV/AIDS, swine flu and hepatitis<sup>5</sup>; and

Whereas, since the outbreak of Covid-19, Cuba has sent 3,700 health workers in 52 international brigades to 39 countries overwhelmed by the pandemic, with requests for assistance from many more countries<sup>6</sup>; and

Whereas, the pandemic has shown that international cooperation is essential for public health, and Cuba has led the way with its medical internationalism and solidarity; and

Whereas, the U.S. has consistently worked to undermine the progress demonstrated above in the educational and medical areas; and

Whereas, shortages and economic hardship caused by U.S. sanctions and the resulting social tensions are used as a pretext for intervention and regime change;<sup>7</sup>

Therefore, be it

**RESOLVED**, that the PSC calls on the Biden Administration and Congress to end the devastating 61-year economic, financial and commercial blockade, as well as travel restrictions on U.S. residents to Cuba and Cuban citizens to the U.S. as so many other unions have done<sup>8</sup>; and

**RESOLVED**, that we call upon the AFT to educate and mobilize all members and students against these inhumane and unjust policies; and

**RESOLVED**, we call on the PSC to bring this resolution to the AFT<sup>9</sup> convention, demanding that they reverse their support for U.S. sanctions against Cuba.
