14:10	Continue your two-guide model as you discuss events in the region and in Europoe in the 19th and early 20th Century on the way to <b>Yad Vashem</b> , the Holocaust Remembrance Center.
16:30	Take a walking tour of West Jerusalem's <b>Ein Kerem</b> , including discussion of both its religious significance and its place in different narratives about Zionism and the War of 1948.
	Discuss key events up to today and debrief with both guides.

DAY 6: Fri Mar 24: Judean Desert (Bus, 1 Guide)	
Time	Activity
7:00	Breakfast at hotel
	On Friday, head east out of Jerusalem for a steady descent into the Judean desert and <b>Jordan Valley.</b>

15:00	Then head north along the Jordan to the Galilee - Stop for meditation with <b>Rev. Dan Burchett</b>
14:00	Enjoy a float in the nearby <b>Dead Sea</b> , and stop for a time of reflection at the Jordan River site where pilgrims mark the baptism of Jesus, as well as the crossing of the ancient Israelites into Canaan.
11:30	Also visit <b>Qumran</b> , site where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in the 20th Century, and discuss theories about why they were there, and who lived at the site.
9:00	Visit <b>Jericho</b> , one of the oldest inhabited cities in the world, and also one of its lowest. (Group leader to choose ahead: Take cable car to the monastery at the of <b>Mt of Temptation</b> , or take a tour of Hisham's Palace and its amazing mosaic floors.)

	Visit with <b>Rev. Yohanna Katanacho</b> , the academic dean at Nazareth Evangelical College, to discuss Palestinian responses to various theologies of the Holy Land they encounter from Western Christians.
	Enjoy some time in the <b>Soukh</b> (stop by the famous Al-Babour Spice Shop if time permits!), and visit the impressive <b>Basilica of the Annunciation</b> with its collection of artwork from around the world depicting Mary and Christchild.
	As you head out toward Tel Aviv, stop at <b>Givat Haviva Kibbutz' Center for a Shared Society</b> to hear from a speaker about their work.  Finally, bid farewell to your guide and driver.
