- **Ethos**

- **Pathos**

Pathos can be called a mode of persuasion that appeals to the emotions of your readers. It is powerful as it allows people to connect with each other and experience the kind of emotions you want them to feel.

- **Logos**

Logos refers to the logical side of the audience where you use logical ethos in your persuasive essays. You should avoid using faulty logic in your body paragraphs, as it will affect the credibility of your work.

- **Kairos**

The fourth mode of persuasion as given by Aristotle is Kairos, which means that the writer or speaker should create an ideal moment to convey the message. This can be achieved by connecting your personal experiences with the supporting evidence.
