The SEAGO region FY16 FTA Section 5310 (Coordinated Mobility Program) awards were administratively added to the TIP.

At the last meeting the TAC approved a provisional TIP Amendment involving CCH 12-10 and CCH15-01 (Davis Road Improvements). The projects were unable to meet ADOT's June 30th due date for obtaining Federal funding authorization due to a ROW clearance issue.

ADOT finance extended the authorization deadline to August 31st. The project was unable to meet that deadline for the reason noted above. The project was reprogrammed for FY16 and the funds involved in this project were loaned to ADOT with an October 1, 2015, return date.

#### 6. SEAGO/SVMPO SHSP RFP (Review and Approval)

Chris Vertrees directed the TAC to page 19 of the Agenda Packet to review the draft Notice of Request for Proposals for Southeastern Arizona Governments Organization/Sierra Vista Metropolitan Planning Organization Consulting Services for the Joint Regional Strategic Highway Safety Plan.

Chris commented that the proposed framework begins on page 6 of the RFP. The framework was approved by the TAC at the last meeting. ADOT reviewed the RFP and changed some verbiage, but there were no changes to the approved framework.

Randy Petty asked about predictive analysis. Chris Vertrees stated that predictive analysis was included in the original RFP but was then removed because the cost would sky rocket. Michael Bryce commented that is can be included in the plan if the TAC thinks it is important to include. Mark Hoffman was not sure how much more it would be.

Chris Vertrees suggested that the consultant identify issues/big gaps in data. Phil Ronnerud suggested that the consultant have adequate room to help the TAC identify and bridge the gaps. The task is time intensive and deals with a lot of territories that people don't want people in. Developing relationships is necessary to have a data set and should be a priority for the region.

The TAC suggested and agreed to various verbiage changes to the RFP.

Attached is our 2016-2020 TIP Amendment #2. The following TIP requests have been submitted by Clifton and Greenlee County:

The Zorrila Bridge Rehabilitation Project was approved by our TAC at our September 2014 meeting. In March 2015, the Town of Clifton submitted a PARA grant application to ADOT for pre-scoping of the project. The pre-scoping report was completed on November 5, 2015. The following are the costs identified in the document. The project will be funded through the off-system bridge program as follows:

FY2016 - Zorilla Street Bridge Rehabilitation, Structure #9633 - Design - Federal/\$132,085 Local Match/\$7,983 Total/\$140,068

FY2018 – Zorilla Street Bridge Rehabilitation, Structure #9633 – Construction Federal/\$729,896 Local Match/\$44,118 Total/\$774,014

Greenlee County has submitted an STP request involving the Campbell Blue Bridge. The project's preliminary design shows a structure approximately 2 times the length as the one that was washed out. Project cost estimates are at \$1,200,000. The project is being funded through the off-system bridge program. However, the program is capped at \$1,000,000. STP funding support is needed to complete the project. If approved, the project will be included in the TIP as follows:

FY2016 – Campbell Blue Bridge Replacement – Construction – Federal/\$200,000 Local Match/\$11,400 Total/\$211,400

Hope all is well. With the completion of the attached Zorilla Street Bridge pre-scoping document you can now move forward with adding the project to the SEAGO TIP utilizing off-system bridge funding. If the town is ready to move forward with the project, please request through SEAGO to have the project added to the regional TIP as follows:

FY2016 - Zorilla Street Bridge Rehabilitation, Structure #9633 – Design – Federal/\$132,085 Local Match/\$7,983 Total/\$140,068 FY2018 – Zorilla Street Bridge Rehabilitation, Structure #9633 – Construction – Federal/\$729,896 Local Match/\$44,118 Total/\$774,014

The above costs are based on the higher steel plate decking estimate in the pre-scoping document using a 5.7% match requirement. The costs can be later amended in the TIP depending on what decking option is chosen during design. The ADOT/LPA section will assign an ADOT project manager after the project is placed on the regional TIP.

**RE:** APPROVAL TO PURSUE STP LOANS

As you can see by the STP Ledger, we are in need of \$307,276 in STP Apportionments and \$321,956 in Obligation Authority (OA) to complete our projects programmed for FY2016. If the TAC approves the additional \$200,000 in STP needed to complete the Campbell Blue Bridge project we will be in need of \$519,303 in STP Apportionments and \$521,956 in OA. I will be asking for your approval to pursue the loans needed to meet our FY16 obligations.

#### Potential options include:

- Borrowing SVMPO's FY16 Apportionment of \$307,276 and OA of \$293,380.
- In addition, we can re-borrow our FY15 loan repayment of \$307,276 in apportionments and \$293,380 in OA.
- NACOG has STP funding that they are willing to loan. We can take advantage of that situation and attempt to arrange a loan with them.

All obligations will need to be re-payed in FY17. This may require the reprogramming of Douglas Chino Road project which is tentatively scheduled for FY17 to be moved to FY18.

RE: SEAGO/SVMPO JOINT REGIONAL STRATEGIC HIGHWAY SAFETY PLAN

The following is an update on the progress of our SEAGO/SVMPO Joint Regional Strategic Highway Safety Plan project:

- In June, the SEAGO Administrative and Executive Committees approved a \$350,000 HSIP project that would allow SEAGO to develop a Joint Regional Strategic Highway Safety Plan with SVMPO.
- In August our Executive Board approved allowing SEAGO to develop a 'Request for Proposals', to advertise for, and to select a consultant to assist in the development of the safety plan.
- A draft RFP was developed and presented to our TAC at our September meeting. The TAC recommended some changes that were incorporated into the RFP.
- An RFP review/ranking committee consisting of a representative from Cochise (Karen Lamberton), Graham (Randy Petty), Greenlee (Phil Ronnerud), Santa Cruz (Juan Guerra) Counties, SVMPO (Dan Coxworth) and ADOT (Mark Hoffman) was established at the TAC meeting.
- ADOT requires that a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Professional Services Goal be established by their Business Engagement and Compliance Office. SEAGO submitted a goal request worksheet on September 24, 2015. SEAGO received a DBE goal of 3.86% on October 16, 2015.
- SEAGO advertised the RFP on November 2, 2015.
- The RFP can be downloaded at http://seago.org/?q=notices.
- A forty-five day advertisement window is required. SEAGO expects to unseal the bids on or about December 18, 2016.
- I will forward the RFP responses along with the scoring sheet the week of December 21, 2015.
- The review committee will need to meet the week of January 4<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> to be in position to make recommendations for our January 21<sup>st</sup> TAC meeting.
- The review committee will screen the RFP responses and will recommend 2 to 4 applicants that will present to a Joint SEAGO/SVMPO TAC Meeting in January.
- We expect a consultant to be in place and work to begin no later than March 1, 2016.
