Welcome from Cochise County!

If you have ever had the pleasure of walking into the Cochise County Board of Supervisors building, you would be greeted by this statue.

According to the plaque, this is George Warren (1849-1893) the miner immortalized on the great seal of the State of Arizona. Warren is credited with having located the body of copper ore, which later was known as the Copper Queen Mine, one of Arizona's most productive copper mines.

The Copper Queen Mine ceased operations in 1975.

Copper mining, as many of us know, helped shape the economic future of Southern Arizona.

Today, there are 10 operational copper mines in Arizona, that accounted for 68% of domestic copper production in the U.S.*


The estimated number of potential trick-or-treaters in 2017 — children ages 5 to 14

"¡Todos Contamos!"**


The Chair of the Yuma CCC, Supervisor Martin Porchas, said recently, "Participating in the 2020 Census is completely safe."

National Disability Employment Awareness Month: October 2018

National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) roots go back to 1945, when Congress enacted a law declaring the first week in October each year 'National Employ the Physically Handicapped Week.' In 1962, the word 'physically' was removed to acknowledge the employment needs and contributions of individuals with all types of disabilities. In 1988, Congress expanded the week to a month and changed the name to 'National Disability Employment Awareness Month.'"
