




- Certified Public Mileage (CPM): *The sum of all public roads in the state that are, passable with a standard passenger car, not restricted by any gates or other barriers, publicly accessible, and includes BIA lands.*
**Note: there are exceptions where private roads are counted in CPM*

 - ADOT reports road Ownership/Maintainership as part of HPMS
 - ARNOLD (statewide GIS network) requirements are leading to significant increase in Certified Public Mileage
- AZGEO Tool will allow agencies to see CPM by agencies and edit Ownership/Maintainership information.



1. Call to Order and Introductions

Chair Michael Bryce called the meeting to order at 10:19 a.m. Chris Vertrees conducted a roll call of members and guests that were participating on the phone.

2. Call to the Public

Chairman Bryce made a Call to the Public and no one spoke.

3. Approval of March 19, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Chairman Bryce asked the TAC to review the minutes for needed corrections. Michael Bryce asked for a motion to approve the March 19, 2020 Meeting Minutes.

MOTION: Mark Hoffman moved to approve

SECOND: Michelle Johnson

ACTION: APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY

4. STBG Ledger Report

Chris Vertrees referred the TAC to the Ledger Report located on page 7 of their packet. He advised the TAC of the following:

- \$12,892 in HSIP funding from the Santa Cruz County Sign Replacement Project was returned to SEAGO as the result of Final Voucher savings. This left SEAGO with \$12,392 in unused OA in FFY20. Chris will be attempting to borrow the needed STBG apportionments in order to utilize the available OA.
- Chris noted that SEAGO STBG is fully committed through FFY2024. Safford will be responsible for any additional costs that exceed the \$3,653,581 programmed. If there are no significant changes in population data from the 2020 Census we should have \$433,199 in apportionments and \$380,421 in OA available for programming/loan in FY25.

5. TIP Report

Chris advised the TAC that no TIP amendment requests were received for this meeting.

Chris advised that The SEAGO 2021-2025 TIP completed its 45-day Public Comment period on May 18, 2020. SEAGO received no public comments. The TIP will be submitted to ADOT as approved at our March meeting.

6. Election of Vice Chair

Chris advised the TAC that Article 6 of the SEAGO TAC Bylaws requires that a Chairperson and Vice-Chairperson be elected at the first meeting of the new calendar year. In January we conducted our annual selection of officers. Selected were:

Chairperson: Michael Bryce – Graham County
Vice Chairperson: Randy Petty – City of Safford

On March 19, 2020, Lance Henrie (Safford Public Works Director/City Engineer) advised the TAC that Randy Petty is no longer with the City of Safford. Chris advised that a replacement for Randy as Vice-Chair will need to be selected at our May meeting.

After discussion Tom Palmer/Town of Thatcher was nominated to be Vice-Chair. Tom agreed to serve. Chairman Bryce asked for a motion to approve Tom Palmer/Town of Thatcher as Vice-Chair.

MOTION: Lance Henrie moved to approve Tom Palmer as Vice-Chair.

SECOND: Michelle Johnson

ACTION: APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY

8. Census Response Rate Update

Chris referred the TAC to page 12 of their packet. Chris reviewed the response rates and asked the TAC to promote the Census within their agencies and to the public.

9. LPA Section Updates

Mark Henige reviewed the minutes March 12, 2020, of the Arizona Local Public Agency Stakeholder Meeting. He and Jennifer Henderson provided updates for the LPA section.

10. District Engineer's Report

There were no staff present from the Southeast and Southcentral Districts to provide project updates.

10. Regional Program Reports

Those in attendance reported their current status of local projects and issues.

11. Items for General Discussion

Chris Vertrees indicated that the ADOT GIS Section will present its functional classification change request tool. Chris indicated we will need to review our FY21 HSIP projects at our July meeting.

RE: SEAGO PROJECT REVIEWS

At our last meeting, we had a limited discussion involving our FY21 HSIP projects. Concerns were raised involving two HSIP projects:

Cochise County – CCH21-01 (Charleston, Double Adobe, Barataria Roads – Edge & Center Rumble Strips): The County has expressed concern that the chip seal surface and lack of shoulders impacts the viability of the project. ***The project is currently programmed for design in FY21 in the amount of \$264,000. It is programmed for construction in FY22 in the amount of \$383,940.***

Graham County – GGH 21-01 (Golf Course Road, Cottonwood Wash Road - Shoulders and Rumble Strips): Graham County advised that US-70 has had a significant increase in crashes. Graham County indicated a desire to pursue reallocating this funding to address the concerns involving US-70. ***The project is currently programmed for design in FY21 in the amount of \$225,454. It is programmed for construction in FY22 in the amount of \$2,111,866.***

Due to the upcoming FFY and the SEAGO Executive Board schedule, it is important that final programming decisions need to be made at this meeting.

At our last meeting, the City of Douglas expressed a desire to restart their Chino Road Expansion Phase 2 project. **The project is currently being held as a placeholder in FY25 in the amount of \$80,000 for design and \$3,000,000 in construction.**

Background: The Chino Road Project was originally programmed for construction in FY18 in the amount of \$2,453,000. However a rough estimate provided by the ADOT project manager in August 2017 reflected an increase of \$547,000 to the construction estimate. The ADOT project manager also indicated that an additional \$80,000 was needed to complete design. At our September 2017 TAC meeting, the TAC programmed the estimated \$80,000 needed to complete design. This would allow for a detailed cost estimate to be developed. At our November 2017 TAC meeting, no work had been completed involving the development the cost estimate. At that meeting the TAC voted to move the project to FY19 to provide Douglas additional time to update the cost estimate. It was made clear that the estimate was needed by our March meeting due to the development of the 2019-2023 TIP. At our January 2018 meeting, Douglas reported no action had been taken. At our March

2018 TAC meeting, Douglas reported no action has been taken. Due to the lack of progress the SEAGO TAC and the SEAGO Executive Board voted unanimously to move Thatcher Church Street up to FY19 because it was deemed to be a shovel ready project. This action required re-programming Chino Road to FY2023. In FY19, the project was pushed back to FY25 in an effort to fiscally constrain our TIP.

I will not be looking for a programming decision at this meeting. However, a discussion needs to occur involving the TAC's expectations on the steps needed to bring this project back into good standing.
