#### 1. Call to Order and Introductions

Chair Michael Bryce called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. Chris Vertrees conducted a roll call of members and guests that were participating via Zoom.

#### 2. Call to the Public

Chair Michael Bryce made a Call to the Public and no one spoke.

### 3. Approval of September 16, 2021 Meeting Minutes

Chair Michael Bryce asked the TAC to review the minutes for needed corrections. Chair Michael Bryce asked for a motion to approve the September 26, 2021, Meeting Minutes.

#### 4. State Highway Rail Grade Crossing-Action Plan

Mark Hoffman presented an overview of the State Highway Rail Grade Crossing-Action Plan to the TAC. Mark asked for input regarding safety concerns the TAC has at rail crossings within their jurisdictions. Mark asked the TAC to complete the Public/Stakeholder Survey by November 24, 2021. The link for the survey was provided to the TAC.

### 5. STBG Ledger Report

Chris Vertrees referred the TAC to the STBG Ledger Report located on pages 7 of their packet. Chris advised the TAC that the Ledger reflects the \$198,554 approved at the July TAC meeting for the SEAGO Region Road Pavement Assessment Project. Chris indicated that we have \$146,618 in Apportionments and \$93,837 in STBG OA available for the year. If not needed, he will loan it out in March.

## 6. TIP Report

Chris advised the TAC that SEAGO did not receive any amendment requests for this meeting. However, SEAGO received a request from Santa Cruz County to add the Ruby Road Bridge at Potrero Creek Replacement Project to the Future Project Section of our FY22-26 TIP. Chris advised that Santa Cruz is applying for CMAQ funding for the project. Inclusion in the Future Project Section of the TIP will provide support for their application.

Chris advised that the SEAGO Region Future Project Programming Procedures were reviewed and approved by the SEAGO TAC on November 20, 2014, and by the SEAGO Executive Board on February 27, 2015. The procedures allow for member agencies to submit a request to include a project in the Future Project Section of the TIP. The procedures require that the SEAGO TAC review and approve the placement of a project on the list. Placement on the list does not indicate any commitment involving the use of Regional funds.

Chris stated that this project was reviewed and ranked by the SEAGO TAC in July through the development of our RTAC Priority Project List. The project was ranked #1 during the RTAC List selection process and the TAC recommended the use of State Surplus Funding in the amount of \$1,517,304. The project estimate is currently \$13,631,315. Santa Cruz has indicated a local commitment of \$4,500,000.

If approved, the project will be added to the Future Project Section of the TIP in the following manner:

David Do provided updates for the ADOT LPA section. David indicated that a Call for OSB Projects will be coming out later in the day.

### 9. District Engineer's Report

There was no staff present from the Southeast and Southcentral Districts to provide project updates.

**RE:** REGIONAL ROAD PAVEMENT ASSESSMENT PROJECT - UPDATE

I had anticipated that we would be reviewing and ranking the RFP for the Regional Road Pavement Assessment Project at this meeting. We had a delay in the development of the RFP due to the establishment of a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal for the project. The DBE Goal was established on December 10, 2021. The DBE goal was 0.00%.

SEAGO was able to publish the RFP on December 23, 2021. Due to the holidays, the RFP will close at 4PM on January 28, 2022. Each RFP response and an electronic score form will be forwarded to our TAC members on January 31, 2022.

The selection process for contractors for this project will be primarily qualifications-based. However, the vendor approach to the project and overall project cost indicated in the proposal will also be a significant factor in the evaluation process. The following criteria will be used to evaluate proposals. Numbers in parentheses indicate the relative weight assigned to each category.

## Firm Profile (10 points)

This section is intended to familiarize the selection committee with the proposing contractor firms. Proposing contractors shall include a brief profile of their company and each subcontractor. The profile should provide an overview of each firm's areas of expertise, recent experience with similar projects, and primary market areas. For each similar study/project listed, the contractor shall provide a brief description of services provided, the outcome of the project, the name and phone number of the client project manager, start and end dates and total dollar value. Status as an eligible Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), Woman Owned Business Enterprise (WOBE), Minority Owned Business Enterprise (MOBE), or any other special classification as described in the Arizona Department of Transportation Procurement policies as they relate to DBE contracting requirements will receive 10 points priority ranking.

# Contract Manager Experience (10 points)

The contractor should include a strong contract manager with extensive road pavement assessment technology expertise. Overall, the contract manager's profile should convey experience in successfully assisting SEAGO develop and implement this project.

## Expertise and Experience of Key Personnel (10 points)

The contractor should possess experience in the relevant skills needed to successfully accomplish this project. These areas could include:

- 1) Data collection techniques;
- 2) Graphic and mapping presentation;
- 3) User Training.

Proposals should clearly indicate the expertise, background, and availability of each member of the proposed study team. Licenses and other professional credentials should be noted.

## Approach (25 points)

The proposal should discuss in detail how the required work tasks will be carried out. It should include how proposed staff resources will be utilized during each task and how the contractor will coordinate with the project team. The proposal should also discuss the expected relationship between the contractor and the SEAGO Technical Advisory Committee. This section provides proposing contractor with the opportunity to discuss original ideas or concepts that they believe are directly relevant to fulfilling the goals of the project.

# Project Cost (40 Points)

The proposed project cost will also be considered in the selection process. The proposal should include a project budget with a fixed per unit cost rate. The reimbursement base shall be miles analyzed. The contractor shall identify the base costs used to develop the per unit rate.

### DBE, MBE, or WBE Status (5 Points)

The ADOT Business and Compliance Office (BECO) established a DBE goal of 0.00%. However, the firm's status as an eligible Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), Woman Owned Business Enterprise (WOBE), Minority Owned Business Enterprise (MOBE), or any other special classification will be considered in the ranking. The proposal shall indicate any special classification that the contractor may hold.

I would like to get scoring back by February 7, 2022. At our meeting, I will be asking the TAC to approve me to make a vendor selection based upon the highest scored proposal.

Each year, traffic count data collected by local and regional agencies is requested to help the state to comply with the Federal Highway Administration's Highway Performance Monitoring System (HPMS) requirements, which in turn, enables Arizona to receive federal aid funds for eligible roads.

- ADOT is respectfully requesting all 2021 traffic count data collected by your agency. Where possible, data should be imported to the MS2 TCDS web portal
   (<a href="https://seago.ms2soft.com">https://seago.ms2soft.com</a>). Other data formats may be accepted where agencies are not sufficiently familiar with the MS2 TCDS.
- To be included in the 2021 HPMS report, 2021 traffic counts should be loaded by February 1, 2022. Please reply (or request individual jurisdictions reply) indicating where 2021 count data is available and whether that data has been shared.
- Technical assistance and training may be provided to agencies that need support in the data import process. Tutorial Story Maps on uploading traffic data is available on the ADOT Data Analytics website, <a href="mailto:here">here</a>. As part of ADOT's recent Statewide Traffic Data Management Program, a statewide traffic count status dashboard has been produced to allow local agencies to view where traffic counting efforts are needed. ADOT is encouraging local public agencies to use this dashboard as a tool to plan their yearly traffic count programs in accordance with ADOT federal reporting requirements.
