1. Call to Order and Introductions

Vice Chair Tom Palmer called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m.

2. Call to the Public

No one from the public was present.

3. Approval of Minutes for 3/20/25

Vice Chair Tom Palmer asked the TAC to review the minutes from the March 20, 2025, meeting for needed corrections. He then asked for a motion to approve and requested a second.

MOTION: Leonard Fontes
SECOND: Bradley Simmons

ACTION: APPROVED UNANIMOUSLY

4. ADOT Traffic Data Coordination Presentation

Sanja Katic-Jauhar provided an overview of the services that ADOT offers to member agencies. ADOT encourages COGs and MPOs to implement traffic studies and counts, especially when there is construction going on in specific areas to show the impact to traffic and engineering design. She advised that when agencies are told a February 1st deadline for

traffic data, ADOT is planning to conduct quality control (QC) (deadline April 15th) before reporting it to FHWA (June 15th). Even though traffic data is collected once a year, it is constantly in use. 3 year (interstates and expressways, and NHS connectors) and 6-year cycles (grants, sample panels, minor arterials and minor urban collectors). All collected traffic data should be reported regardless of the functional class. She provided examples of events to emphasize the importance of reporting data.

Lucas Murray of the ADOT MBPD analytics team shared that the "We Love Your Input Tool" online tool used for reporting functional class change requests or ownership changes broke down and they are working on building a replacement tool. Until the replacement tool is complete, they have a "We Love Your Input" temp tool and he shared the link in chat. He demonstrated how to use the temporary tool and explained how to obtain help, if needed. Chris Vertrees advised everyone that SEAGO would share the meeting video with everyone so that they would have the information just demonstrated.

5. District Engineers' Report No one was available to provide the Quarterly Project Report.

6. STBG Ledger Report

Chris Vertrees directed members to page 26 for the STBG Ledger Report. He advised that FY25 shows a \$160,185 balance in allay which was a loan to ADOT which will be repaid next year; FY26 Chino Road realignment project current estimated amount to borrow was \$717,000 but has shifted down a bit. He advised that they will be receiving \$105,000 from SVMPO next year; and he is expecting to get back \$150,000 from the Chase Creek Bridge project that was cancelled by Clifton. Mr. Vertrees advised that if those two events are accomplished, then they will have to borrow \$465,000 to complete the Chino Road project. He is reaching out to other COGs and MPOs to secure that balance.

7. TIP Report

SEAGO REGION FY26-30 TIP

Chris Vertrees advised the SEAGO Region 2026-2030 TIP was posted for a 45-day public comment period on April 14, 2025. The public comment period will conclude on May 18, 2023. To date, no public comments have been received. If no comments are received by the COB on May 28, 2025. Our FY23 TIP will be finalized to include any recent TIP amendments. The FY26 TIP will be submitted to ADOT prior to July 1, 2025, due date.

SEAGO REGION FY24-28 TIP

Mr. Vertrees stated that since our last meeting, no TIP requests have been submitted to SEAGO. Chris advised members to SEAGO FY 2024-2028 TIP Amendment #12 and SEAGO FY 2026 to 2030 TIP for Public Comment which were attached for their records.

8. SEAGO TIP Future Project Request

SEAGO has received a request from Santa Cruz County to add the West Frontage Road and Peck Canyon Roundabout Enhancements project to the Future Project Section of our FY26-30 TIP. Santa Cruz County submitted a Congressionally Directed Spending (CDS) request of \$2.9 million to Senator Kelly's office. Placing this project in the Future Project Section of the TIP will support current requests and future grant applications.

The SEAGO Region Future Project Programming Procedures were reviewed and approved by the SEAGO TAC on

November 20, 2014, and by the SEAGO Executive Board on February 27, 2015. The procedures allow member agencies to submit a request to include a project in the Future Project Section of the TIP.

The procedures require the SEAGO TAC to review and approve a project placement on the list. Placement on the list does not indicate any commitment involving the use of regional funds.

Vice Chair Palmer asked for a motion to add the future project request to the TIP list.

9. SEAGO FY26 On-Demand Traffic Counting Pilot Project

SEAGO has added an On-Demand Traffic Counting Pilot Project to our FY26 ADOT Work Program. This pilot project will utilize a traffic counting subscription service that collects and combines data from multiple publicly available sources as well as vehicles connected with embedded smart devices to provide real-time traffic count data.

- The project will provide granular data on traffic flow, including metrics such as average daily traffic counts, average daily traffic intersection counts, hourly and daily traffic variations, direction of travel, average speed, and incidents of hard breaking and acceleration.
- Data will be available for all SEAGO roads including statistically enhanced traffic information in areas where actual counts are not available (including dirt roads).
- Data will be readily available to SEAGO member agencies for traffic planning purposes.
- Data will also be shared with ADOT to support HPMS data collection.
- The total cost of the pilot project shall not exceed \$5,000. In mid-May, SEAGO will begin the procurement process to select a vendor for the project.
- Project will kick-off on July 1, 2025.

Mr. Vertrees provided a simple Traffic Count Request Form that will be available at www.seago.org on our Population & Traffic Data page and advised that SEAGO's Technical Services Coordinator (Angelica Novoa) will be the project coordinator. If you are requesting count data for multiple streets, please send an email request to Angelica at anovoa@seago.org.

10. SS4A Program - NOFA

The Department of Transportation has released the fiscal year (FY) 2025 Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program. Established by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), the Safe Streets and Roads for All grant program funds regional, local, and Tribal initiatives through grants to prevent roadway deaths and serious injuries. Over \$982 million is available for FY26.

Our Southeast Arizona Transportation Safety Plan (SEAZ TSP) was developed to be SS4A compliant. If a project was

identified in the plan, it can be used to pursue an Implementation Grant application. In addition, the Resolution by the SEAGO Executive Board approving the plan can also be used to support a SS4A grant application

11. RTAC Project List Development – Call for Projects

Mr. Vertrees shared that the last several years, the Rural Transportation Advisory Council (RTAC) has requested that Greater Arizona COGs and MPOs develop a list of regional priorities consisting of the top projects to be put forward by all the COGs/MPOs in Greater Arizona to the State Legislature for funding. The SEAGO Region was very successful during the FY24 budget cycle. We secured almost \$30 million in projects. Last year we developed a FY25 Priority Project List that included \$36,102,142 in projects. Unfortunately, due to significant budget deficits the State Legislature did not fund any projects from the RTAC list.

Our FY26 RTAC Priority Project List is still alive in the State Legislature. The last update I received is that there may be approximately \$200 million available for transportation-related projects. It is unclear at this time what projects will be funded. I will keep you advised as I receive additional updates.

RTAC has requested that each Greater Arizona COG/MPO once again develop a list of Regional Transportation Priority Projects to be submitted to the State Legislature for funding for the FY27 budget cycle. Last year, we rolled over the project list. I will be looking for clarification from the TAC concerning actions to take involving unfunded projects. SEAGO will have approximately \$40 million to program this year. I should have a final number from RTAC by our TAC meeting.

Our FY27 RTAC list must be submitted to RTAC by the end of August. To meet that deadline, SEAGO is issuing a call for RTAC projects.

12. SEAGO Road Pavement Assessment Project – Update

Chris Vertrees advised that the SEAGO Executive Board approved the project. We will have the project through at least April of next year. They want to focus on roads that have been improved once the initial assessment has been completed.

13. ADOT LPA Section Updates

Mark Henige from ADOT was in attendance to provide updates regarding the ADOT LPA Section.

14. Regional Local Program Reports

Those in attendance reported the status of local projects and issues.

15. Items for General Discussion

Chris Vertrees shared the following items for the July meeting: he will invite Vaisala to the July meeting so that new members can learn more about the portal and tools available to them; set the parameters for STBG call for projects for FY27-FY29; finalize selection of RTAC projects; Rural Transportation Summit will be in Sierra Vista this year.

Mark Henige encouraged members to reach out to Martha Solarzano, ADOT grant manager, who is having monthly meetings with the division office and following grants closely. If there is any information she can share, offer letters of support, or provide assistance to define who will administer the grant, etc., he encourages members to utilize her knowledge.

SEAGO REGION FY26-30 TIP

The SEAGO Region 2026-2030 TIP was posted for a 45-day public comment period on April 14, 2025. The public comment period will concluded on May 18, 2025. No public comments have been received. The TIP has been finalized to include the TIP amendments noted below. The FY26 TIP was submitted to ADOT on June 25, 2025.

SEAGO REGION FY24-28 TIP

Since our last meeting the following Administrative changes/additions were made to the TIP:

CCH 23-01 – Cochise County (Davis Road Rehabilitation, MP 5 & 13) – The ADOT Project Manager advised Cochise County that the Construction Phase of the project need to be moved to FY26. The change was made to allow more time for the project to go through the advertisement process. As a result, construction was moved from FY25 to FY26.

On May 28, 2025, Cochise County was advised by ADOT that two of their OSB Bridge Projects had been approved. Leslie Creek Bridge and Middle March Creek Bridge were approved for scoping using FY26 STBG-OSB funds. The projects were added to the TIP as follows:

CCH 26-01 – Cochise County (Leslie Canyon Bridge Replacement):

RE: DEVELOPMENT OF RTAC REGIONAL PROJECT LIST

As discussed at our May TAC meeting:

The last several years, the Rural Transportation Advisory Council (RTAC) has requested that Greater Arizona COGs and MPOs develop a list of regional priorities consisting of the top projects to be put forward by all the COGs/MPOs in Greater Arizona to the State Legislature for funding. The SEAGO Region was very successful during the FY24 budget cycle. We secured almost \$30 million in projects. Last year we developed a FY25 Priority Project List that included \$36,102,142 in projects. Unfortunately, due to significant budget deficits the State Legislature did not fund any projects from the RTAC list.

This year, we were once again successful in seeing some projects on our list get funded. The following projects were funded:

Frank Reed Road Improvements – City of Nogales - \$1.5 million

Industrial Park Road Improvements – City of Nogales - \$2.9 million

La Quinta Road Improvements – City of Nogales - \$1.8 million

RTAC has again requested that each Greater Arizona COG/MPO develop a list of Regional Transportation Priority Projects be submitted to the State Legislature for funding in the FY27 budget cycle. SEAGO had a total of \$43,322,570 to program. *Unfunded projects were carried over for FY27.* This left us approximately \$10.2 million to include in our FY27 list.

On May 16, 2025, SEAGO issued a Call for Projects. The call closed on June 20, 2025. SEAGO received 4 applications with 3 which were able to be included in our FY27 RTAC list. Those projects were:

8th Street Improvement Project – Graham County - \$2.535 million

Western Avenue/Target Range Road Paving Project – City of Nogales - \$6,927,573

SR 80/Washington Avenue Turn Lane Improvements – City of Douglas - \$1.5 million

A second Nogales application (Commercial Roads Paving Project) could not be included in this year's list. This does not preclude Nogales or any other member agency pursuing direct legislative awards. As we have done in past years, construction contingency line items were not included in the funding recommendations.

Attached is our FY27 programming plan. We do not rank these projects in priority order. Project ranking plays no role in project selection as legislatures prioritize and select projects based upon the needs of their district. It is incumbent on each applicant to reach out to your state legislature and get their support for your project.
