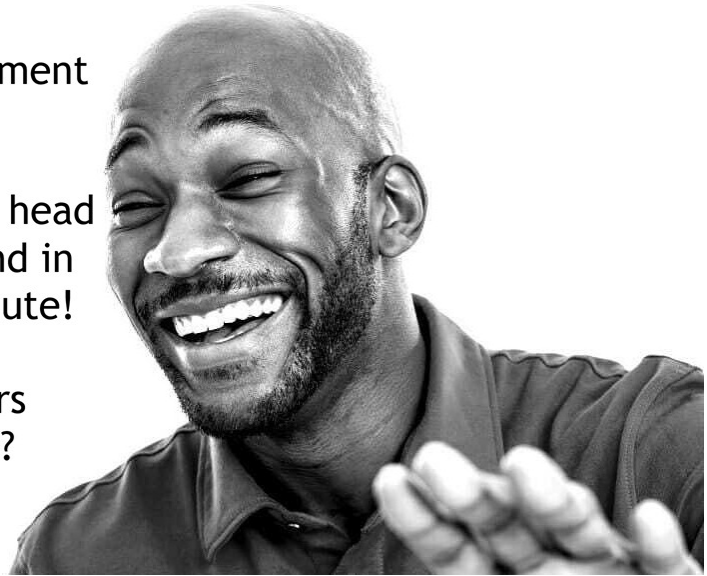


Anchor Seat Delusions
