

**TWO HIGH ARMY MEN
ADVOCATE TRAINING**

MIAMI, Fla., June 20, (AP). — Two high-ranking army officers today advocated universal military training for the nation.

Gen. Jacob L. Devers, commanding general of the Army Ground Forces, told the Reserve Officers Association 21st annual convention that universal training would prove our salvation.

"We of the Army Ground Forces have pushed universal military training, not because of any benefit expected for the regular army since our size is fixed by Congress," the four-star general said at a banquet last night, "but because we see it as the salvation of the nation."

Lt. Gen. J. Lawton Collins, head of the army's information section, told the 800 delegates attending the convention that the nation's defenses are "terribly weak" and that in case of trouble in Europe, "United States forces there are so small that they could easily be overrun."
