

Bozeman Pilot Sees Discs, 'Like Yo-Yo's'

BOZEMAN, July 6 (AP) — Casey Baird, pilot of a P-38 pursuit plane working for the United States geodetic survey, reported today he was forced to evade a group of flying discs, and that his photographer tried to get a picture.

Baird said the film would be developed tomorrow morning.

The photographic plane's pilot said he ran into the flying objects at 32,000 feet and had to dodge out of their path while trying to photograph them. He said there were eight or nine in the group.

Baird described the flying objects as looking like yo-yo's, with a periscope or domelike object on top. He said they were 14 or 15 feet in diameter and travelling rapidly.

One person in Butte and four in Anaconda reported they saw flying objects at dusk tonight.

P. R. Tomis of Butte said he had been skeptical of the reports until he saw a "flying saucer" tonight. He said he called several neighbors who saw the same thing.

At Anaconda, two parties on opposite sides of the town reported seeing what appeared to be a rocket streaking across the sky at extremely high altitude. They discounted the possibility of the object's being fireworks.
