

Jesus Died for Me

Parents: We are sinful and need a Savior. Because of our selfishness and sin, we need someone who can fill in our gaps and save us. This is difficult to share with our kiddos. We don't like them feeling the weight of guilt and feeling responsible for the wrong things they do. But if we neglect to help them confess their sins, our kids don't really see our Savior. Today is a day when we focus on our sin and what Jesus did for us to fix it! In our guilt and shame, we praise You, Jesus, for lifting our load and loving us so much that you died.

Read: Romans 5: 8

But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Discuss: What is a sin? Something we do that is wrong. For example, not doing something our parents ask us to do, being mean to others, being jealous of others.

How do you feel when you sin? Sorry, Ashamed, Guilty, etc...

Who do you go to when you are sorry about things you did wrong? Parents, friends, aunts and uncles, people God gave us who love us and can help us say sorry and go to God for forgiveness.

How much does Jesus love you? Put your arms out to your side and stretch them super wide. Imagine Jesus saying, "This much!" and then He stretched His arms out and He died.

Key Point: Thank you Jesus, My Savior

Thank you, Jesus	(Put hands together in prayer)
My Savior	(Put both arms up towards heaven)


