WINSTON CHURCHILL ON THE AIR

Wednesday 8.30 p.m. On Wednesday of this week, the BBC will broadcast the ceremony of the installation of the Rt. Hon. Winston Churchill as Lord Warden and Admiral of the Claque Ports. Mr. Churchill will reply after the installation.

The broadcast will be half-an-hour in length from six o'clock to six-thirty in the General Overseas Service. It will replace the programme "At the Mulligan Inn" usually heard at that time. This latter programme will be on at 6.30 p.m. instead.

New Leslie Henson Show: In a new variety series beginning this week Leslie Henson will introduce songs and stories from some of his many successful shows. Well-known artists and singers will appear with him in the studio to help illustrate the stories and they will be supported by the BBC Augmented Revue Orchestra and Chorus conducted by Frank Cantall. Broadcasts will be given each Thursday at 8.45 p.m. and also on Saturdays at 7.30 a.m., both in the General Forces Programme.

Paris Peace Conference: Have you been listening to the broadcasts by Harold Nicolson on the Paris Peace Conference of which you were told last fortnight?

There are three talks given by him each week, Sundays at 7.45 p.m., Wednesdays 7.45 p.m. and

Thursdays at 8.30 p.m. all in the Overseas Service. The Wednesday broadcast which takes the place of the usual "Current Events" talk can also be heard at the same time in the North American Service.

"Father Brown": Is Father Brown, the Roman Catholic priest created by G. K. Chesterton a friend of yours? If you don't know him but like detective stories, we advise you to make his acquaintance this week. If you do know him we're sure you'll want to tune in to the broadcast in the form of a play of "The Man in the Passage" one of Chesterton's famous short stories.

Broadcasts will be at 8.30 p.m. on Wednesday in the North American Service and at 7.15 p.m. on Thursday in the Overseas Service. "What is Democracy?" The new series in "Calling the West Indies" on Thursdays at 6.00 p.m. continues this week with a talk by H. B. Myvorn on "An M.P.'s Job." Ronald Moody will also continue his talks on Art.

The Robinson Family: We're sure the hundreds of listeners to "The Robinson Family" series will be interested to learn that "Mr. and Mrs. Robinson" were recently seen by the British public for the first time on July 22nd, when they took part in a television programme designed to explain bread rationing in Britain.

HAVANA SUGAR TRADER SHOT

HAVANA, Aug. 8.—Julio Lobo Olivarez, 46, prominent Havana merchant, was machine-gunned Tuesday night by unidentified assailants in suburban Miramar.

Lobo was shot in the head and right leg. However, a medical report described his condition as not critical. Lobo, general manager of Galban y Lobo sugar operators and importers, told police he did not know who his attackers were nor could he give any reason for being attacked.

Rockets Over Sweden

LONDON, August 11.—More reports of what appear to be rockets over Sweden have been received. People in central Sweden say they have seen flying objects going off in a glow to lit up the sky. One of them fell near a town causing a loud explosion.

Swedish military authorities refused to say which town it fell near as they have issued orders against informing foreign powers where the rockets may have landed.—Radio.
