WASHINGTON, Aug. 13 (AP)—Undersecretary of State Acheson said today he personally is very much interested in reports of rockets flying over Sweden but that the Swedes have not sought any American advice on the subject.

Streaking Ghost Commits Suicide

STOCKHOLM, Aug. 13 (AP)—An eyewitness account published in the Stockholm Aftonbladet yesterday said a 100-foot "ghost rocket" exploded in a blinding flash over Sweden lending support to previous reports that the mystery missiles are equipped with destruction devices which make it impossible to find trace of them.

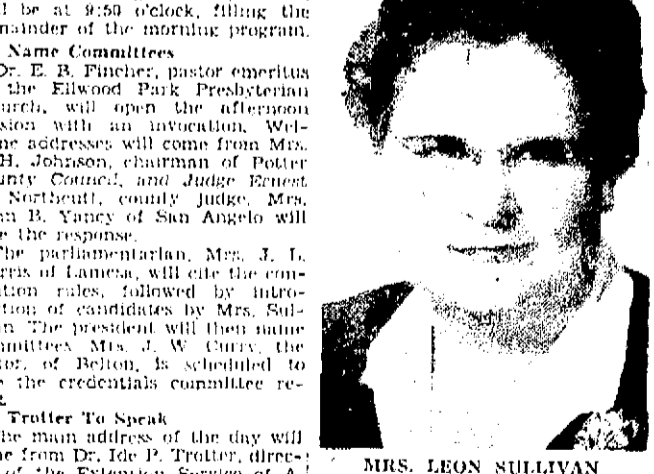
