Holidaysburg Schools Ready For New Term

The Telegraph said a Swedish communist had admitted to its Stockholm correspondent that "he and fellow members were under orders to report through official party channels all available details of rocket flights."

(A United Press dispatch from Oslo said several eyewitnesses had

reported seeing a rocket zoom over the city Saturday night "moving fast as a fighter plane and followed by a trail of smoke and fire.")

The Telegraph said Swedish military authorities had received 800 reports of rockets over Sweden, but that no fragments of the missiles had been found by searchers.

Reliable sources in Stockholm said some of the missiles came

from the direction of Dageo and Oesel islands, off the Estonian coast, and from eastern Karelia, near Lake Onega, the dispatch said.
