

# ***U. S. and British Navies Consider Joint Maneuvers***

LONDON, Aug. 12—A plan for combined American and British naval maneuvers is being "considered," although no decision has yet been reached, officers attached to the staff of Admiral Henry Kent Hewitt, commander of the United States Twelfth Fleet and the United States naval forces in Europe, said today.

Earlier, Comdr. Kenneth Edwards, The Daily Telegraph's well-informed naval correspondent, said that it seemed more than likely that the opportunity would be taken while a number of American warships were stationed in European waters. He believed that American naval authorities had suggested this first peacetime naval collaboration, and he said that there was no doubt that the British Navy was eager to cooperate.
