

Word on Wednesday Bible Study "Humbling Ourselves"

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"You younger men, likewise, be subject to *your* elders; and all of you, clothe yourselves with **humility** toward one another, for God is opposed to THE PROUD, BUT GIVES GRACE TO THE **HUMBLE**. Therefore **humble** yourselves under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you at the proper time," (1 Peter 5:5, 6 NASB 1995)

I. Introduction

- A. English Definition of humble:
 - 1. Having or showing a modest or low estimate of one's own importance.
 - 2. Modest or meek in spirit and manner.
- B. New Testament Definition of humble.
 - 1. Tapeinos (5011): Lowly in spirit. Inner lowliness describes the person who depends on God rather than self (James 1:9, 4:6; 1 Peter 5:5).
 - 2. Tapeinophrosune (5012): The mindset of having a humble opinion of oneself; moderation related to one's inner perspective (Eph. 4:2, Phil. 2:3, Col. 2:18, 23, 1 Peter 3:8, 1 Peter 5:5)
 - 3. Tapeinoo (5013): To make low. To show humility or true lowliness (Matt. 23:12, Luke 14:11, James 4:10, 1 Peter 5:6).
 - 4. Tapeinosis (5014): To bring low. Self-abasement leading one to perceive and lament his moral littleness and guilt (James 1:10, Acts 8:23).
- C. Definition of humbling ourselves:
 - 1. To say or do something which shows we have behaved out of a prideful, self-centered and arrogant disposition; but have now repented, and now we are gentle and humble in heart.

II. Clothing ourselves with humility

A. Nothing should be done out of selfishness or pride, but with the mindset of having a humble opinion of ourselves (Phil. 2:3)



- B. We must have a mutual deference toward others (Phil. 2:4).
- C. We are commanded to have a heart filled with kindness and benevolence (Col. 3:12).
- D. We should receive the word with a mild disposition and gentle spirit (James 1:21).

III. God opposes (resist) the proud

- A. The heart has the capacity to become proud (Deut. 8:14, 2 Kings 14:10, 2 Chron. 25:19).
 - 1.Uzziah's heart became so proud, that he acted corrupt and became unfaithful to God (2 Chron. 26:16).
 - 2.To have a proud that heart is an abomination to God (Prov. 16:5).
 - 3. When Nebuchadnezzar's heart was lifted up and his spirit became so proud that he behaved arrogantly (Dan. 5:20).
- B. God will have a day of reckoning with anyone who is proud, lofty and lifted up (Isa. 2:12).
- C. God will put an end to the arrogance of the proud (Isa. 13:11).
- D. When someone is proud, their soul is not right within, and they do not have peace (Hab. 2:4).
- E. When someone is proud, their mental faculties start to decline, and their thoughts are scattered (Isa. 5:15, Luke 1:51).

IV. Pride is the twin to proud

- A. A person's pride will cause them to be brought low (Prov. 29:23).
- B. Pride goes before destruction and a haughty spirit before a fall (Prov. 16:18).
- C. Jesus said, "For from within, out of the heart of men proceed ... pride ... All these evil things proceed from within and defile the man." (Mark 7:21 23).

V. God gives grace to the humble

Quotation from Proverbs: "Though He scoffs at the scoffers, Yet He gives grace to the afflicted." (Prov. 3:34).

A. Paul acknowledges he is what he is because of the **grace** of God.



"But by the **grace** of God I am what I am, and His **grace** toward me did not prove vain; but I labored even more than all of them, yet not I, but the **grace** of God with me." (1 Cor. 15:10).

- B. God's grace is sufficient to give us the power we need in weakness (2 Cor. 12:9).
- C. God's grace is freely bestowed on us (Eph. 1:6).
- D. Grace was given to each of us according to what Christ wanted to give us (Eph. 4:7).

VI. Humbling Ourselves

- A. The first step to humbling ourselves is the act of consecration, to humble our soul (Lev. 16:29, 16:31, 23:27, 32; Num. 29:7).
- B. Repentance, seeking God and prayer is required (2 Chron. 7:14).
- C. Fasting is an important means to humbling ourselves (Ps. 35:13, 1 Kings 21:27 29, Ezra 8:21, Isa. 58:5).
- D. God hears the desires of the humble (Ps. 10:17).
- E. We must deny our self and apply wisdom (Prov. 11:2).
- F. Follow the example of Jesus, "... for I am gentle and humble in heart (Matt. 11:29).
- G. Learning to live life with humble means (Phil. 4:12).
- H. Summary to humbling ourselves.
 "To sum up, all of you be harmonious, sympathetic, brotherly, kindhearted, and humble in spirit;" (1 Peter 3:8).

VII. The mighty hand of God (submitting to God's sovereign activity in our life)

- A. God allows us to continue in prideful behavior until we fall (Ps. 5:10, Prov. 28:14).
- B. Exposes us in our areas of arrogance and pride (Isa. 16:6, Jer. 48:29).
- C. Becoming broken until we become contrite and repentant (Job 17:1, Ps. 51:17).
- D. Pride, sin, and a haughty spirit will cause us to destroy ourselves (Prov. 16:18, 21:24).

VIII. God will exalt us at the right time

- A. If we wait on God and follow His course for our life, He will exalt us (Ps. 37:34).
- B. "... Whoever humbles himself shall be exalted" (Mark 23:12, Luke 14:11).



C. God exalts those who are humble (Luke 1:52).
