According to Jamie Aten, Ph.D., & Kent Annan, M.Div. in their article, The Church Can't Ignore Mental Health Any Longer, "We are in the middle of a mental health crisis. Seventy percent of adults in the United States have experienced a traumatic event. Over two-thirds of children have experienced a traumatic event by age 16. And 54% of families have been affected by severe natural disasters. Research shows one in five adults experience mental issues such as depression and anxiety every year. Renowned Pastor and Author Tony Evans speaks a lot about the Kingdom of God.
