ALL SIGNS POINT TO JESUS NOTHING TO FEAR BUT FEAR ITSELF - John 6:16-21

Introduction: According to a November 2023 Gallup poll, 40% of Americans are afraid to walk alone at night near their homes. Concerns about being victimized by specific crimes, such as having their cars stolen or homes burglarized, are near record highs. Fear of crime prevents most Americans from engaging in many routine activities, such as visiting entertainment venues and participating in social interactions. However, the Bible states that "God has not given us a spirit of fear, but one of power, love, and sound judgment" (2 Tim. 1:7). When we trust God, He can strengthen our resolve, increase our love for others, and grant us wisdom enough to overcome fear, while we take the necessary precautions to protect ourselves, maintain social interactions with loved ones, and handle the less-than-ideal circumstances life presents.

Conclusion: "Nothing to fear but fear itself" is a famous phrase from President Franklin D. Roosevelt's 1933 inaugural speech. The phrase suggests that if we face our fear rather than allowing ourselves to be paralyzed by it, we can find solutions, take action, and accomplish great things. Fear ruled a man's life for thirty-two years. Afraid of being caught for crimes he had committed, he hid at his sister's farmhouse for over three decades. He went nowhere and visited no one, even missing his own mother's funeral. When he was sixty-four years old, he learned that no charges had ever been filed against him. If he had faced his fear from the beginning, perhaps he wouldn't have lost thirty-two years of living. What are you afraid of? God has not given you a spirit of fear. Don't let your fears control you! We must face them. Don't serve a life sentence because you allowed fear to imprison you.
