## I. JESUS DECLARES HE IS THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE

(John 11:25–27) "Jesus said to her, 'Your brother will rise again.' Martha said to him, 'I know that he will rise again in the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said to her, 'I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me, even if he dies, will live.'" — John 11:23–25
