
# JOHN PERRY'S STATEMENT TO DAILY MAIL ONLINE

Thank you for getting in touch. I haven't read the article but have heard about it.


I don't have anything to say for the record, but will tell you that the person behind it has been pursuing a vendetta against his former church for years and this story is one of the means he has used.

THE COURT: So just ask Ms. Cone about her experiences.

MR. DAVIS: I may become a lawyer, if I stay here long enough and you coach me. Okay.

- Q. (BY MR. DAVIS) So the police told me, on December 5, 2012, that the investigation was closed and over and that they had already talked to everybody. So could you think back a little bit and see if it was sometime at the end of 2012, maybe?
- A. According to my records, I got a call in July of 2013 by a detective who was researching the case. That's what's documented in my records.
  - Q. Do you know who that was?
- A. I don't. I have it written down, but I don't know what detective it was. I met him in person, I talked to him on the phone. he came to my office, and the three of us had a conversation.

1 And I will say, sir, that that was 2 extremely traumatizing for my client. Okay, and so your testimony -- are you 3 saying -- I just want to be clear -- you're saying 4 I'm the one traumatizing your client? Α. Yes. Has the child molester, has he traumatized 7 8 your client? MR. CRAIN: Objection, your Honor. 9 10 Irrelevant. 11 THE COURT: I will sustain the objection. Obviously I think it's inherit in the 12 witness' testimony that the underlying event 13 14 was traumatizing, so -- and I think what she's saying is that by you publishing information 15 regarding the incident, that when **REDACTED** 16 hears about it, it continues to traumatize 17 18 RED . 19 I think that's what she testified to. THE WITNESS: Exactly. 20 21 THE COURT: I don't think she said that 22 you've intended to do anything, but she's saying when **REDACTED** hears about it, it has a 23 24 traumatic effect.

I'm guessing that you care and want the truth to come out.

However, what ends up happening is, it ends up backfiring, and **RED** just really is highly anxious, and the word is "revictimized," every time something comes out on BuzzFeed or something like that,

THE COURT: That's your experience. She can't -- she doesn't know anything about your experience. So you're asking her to speculate about something you did. She doesn't know anything about that.

She only knows -- she's going to testify to her experience. So when you say something like that, and "I went to the folks in 2012," she doesn't know that.

but I will also say that the more details you ask me related to **RED** sexual abuse will retraumatize **RED** far more than some other things have in the past year or so. And that would be my concern as a clinician.

Q. (BY MR. DAVIS) It's relevant because we're sitting here in 2016. Back in 2008, people were discussing something, and I have a question I want to ask you.

Do you practice relational restoration?

- A. As an entity?
- Q. As a counseling technique.
- A. Yes, I don't know what that specific term means, but if that needs to happen, then absolutely.
- Q. So when there -- a child's molested, is relational restoration -- and the Presbyterian Church of America has admitted that they did do for a long time -- is that a technique where you sit down with the victim and the person who did the molesting and go over that in tremendous detail to try to find out what he did?
- A. Well, so it is not appropriate for every relationship to be restored; it's just not. In general population, mostly it is not appropriate.

Q. Was it used in this case?

A. I don't know in this case what the church did with it. I only know from my perspective what happened in counseling sessions.

Are you asking me about the church?

- Q. Did you ever sit down with the parties involved and go through that practice with them?
- A. I sat down with the parties involved, and the purpose was not relational restoration. The purpose was disclosure and healing for my client and also some -- it -- it is helpful when somebody admits to harming you, in front of you.
- Q. Does that ever backfire with anybody?

  Does it ever hurt them? Is it ever traumatic for them?
- A. So are you asking if the process of relational ---
- Q. Is that done, like it would be, like, on a high school coach and a 13-year-old girl, where the school wanted to get them together, set them down together and make sure that didn't happen, to try to have the child reclaim something with the person and still restore the gift that the person's done -- no police involved or anything, but try to work that out, is that something that -- does that
