I can't -- if I, you know, try to come out and, like, be defensive, it just looks, you know, like I'm being defensive. There's nothing I can do to overcome this.

I just -- Covenant's -- you know, it's a church, you know, and you think no one is going to, like, gossip at church. But, I mean, there's a ton of people who are around the community, and if your pastor is wearing a bulletproof vest and is, like, telling people that he's scared of Austin Davis and thinks he's a threat and they're going to have to call the police, like, you know, like, that's going

to scare people and that's going to make them talk and that's going to -- then I'm the girl with the church shooter dad.

And, I mean, like, last Sunday, he went up to Covenant and they called the police and he had to leave the service and go talk to police. And they were, like, you're trespassing, you can't be here, and then it turns out they don't even have a right to tell him he's trespassing because he's not a threat. And the police couldn't arrest him or do anything because -- you know, but they made this whole show of, like, we're going to call the police and we're going to get you out of here because you're a threat and we have armed security here and, you know, unmarked vehicles. And they just make it look like it's a huge big deal when it's not and there is no threat.

But that just looks -- then I -- you know, I have to deal with what people think after that.
