

# **Morongo Band of Mission Indians– Operational Phase 2a - Activation Support Concept**



#### **Priorities:**

- Stabilize the incident while ensuring life, safety, and managing resources efficiently and cost effectively
- Protect property including Tribal government enterprises, Cultural and religious Resources
- Reunify a full Tribal Council

# **Objectives:**

- Activate Morongo Emergency Operations Plan, annexes, and ESF's following the catastrophic incident and decide on operational periods
- Develop the EOC's action plan and the IAP
- Upon activation of the Emergency Operations Center and/or supporting ESF(s), have the qualified personnel and information system in place to inform the Tribe, Tribal Government staff, and people on the reservation

# Assumptions Based on Planning Factors:

- Loss of power
- Limited communications
- Transportation/inaccessible
- Lack of personnel
- Local and regional capabilities inundated
- Critical resources compromised

## Tier One Capabilities(E + 24):


- Activate Public Communications FM radio system, one call now notifications, disaster net radio
- Windshield survey/damage assessment
- First responder prep for long term capabilities
- Council motions in place to run incident through the EOC Manager if no council/policy group is present

#### Gaps:

- No IPAWS, WEA capabilities
- Insufficient local Mutual Aid
- Transient sheltering
- Critical infrastructure restoration

#### **Constraints / Concerns:**

- Government/Business Operations
- Search & Rescue
- Personnel/staff availability
- Access to Reservation
- Hazmat



#### **Priorities:**

- Mass search & Rescue
- Sustain & support shelter operations
- Find solutions for Unmet needs
- Establish IHS clinic for public health if staff is available

- Deploy on hand sheltering capabilities
- Deploy FEMA FDR trailers
- MCI trailer
- Mobile EOC
- Shower trailers
- Tribal MOU's

# **Objectives:** continue objectives from 2a

- Support mass search & rescue operations
- Resource and staffing to sustain shelter support
- Disaster declaration
- Critical infrastructure inspections
- Asses long term resource capabilities
- Daily mission task request to State and FEMA

#### Gaps:

- Sheltering for transient population
- Building/engineering inspectors
- Essential life sustaining resources
- Reservation access
- IHS medical staff obligated to city/county and all rights turned over to respective county


# **Assumptions Based on Planning Factors:**

#### **Priorities:**

- Road clearance & restoration
- Restoration and repair of critical lifelines
- Debris removal
- Short term & long term housing & schools
- Identify unmet needs of community
- Public health
- protect property including Tribal government enterprises, Cultural and religious Resources

# **Tier One Capabilities(72 + hours):**

- Measurable decreases in long-term vulnerability
- Risk assessment and risk management of critical infrastructure
- Whole community planning

# **Objectives:**

- IA/PA needs
- Tribal businesses and enterprise recovery
- Temporary and permanent housing
- Water, utilities, and transportation sustainment
- Continuously identify, analyze, and maintain facility risk assessments for critical infrastructure
- Law enforcement

### Gaps:

- Access to additional resources
- Power & Fuel
- Life sustaining resources
- Personnel
- Long term housing
- Inability to run Tribal businesses and enterprise recovery

# Assumptions Based on Planning Factors:

- Casino collapse with potential of thousands trapped
- House/building fires on reservation with potential of spread to wildland
- Hazmat from train derailment

## **Constraints / Concerns:**

- CPODS lack thereof
- Critical infrastructure restoration capabilities
- Fatality management
