There's a reason **Stephen Harper** felt compelled to publicly say he did not sign any petition calling for a referendum on - Alberta "leaving" Canada.

current politicians pretend not to - *separatism is political poison* - and once it's unleashed, it does not stay neatly contained. Harper framed his remarks around national pride, not around grievance. That wasn't accidental.

In a world where nationalism is resurging, he drew a sharp distinction between confidence in your country and the kind of resentment politics that tear countries apart.

ALBERTA separatism falls squarely into the second category. It isn't about strength or leverage. It's about frustration being misdirected into something destructive. The subtext was impossible to miss.

Members of Premier Danielle Smith's own caucus are reportedly backing a push for separation. Harper didn't name names, but he didn't have to. He's signalling that "flirting with secession" is reckless, unserious, and damaging to Canada's standing at a moment when stability actually matters.

Jean Chrétien reinforced that point from a different angle. His observation that the world may be witnessing the beginning of the end of American dominance wasn't alarmist. It was realistic.

Global power is shifting. Institutions are under strain. In that kind of environment, countries that *hold together* are the ones that protect their citizens' interests. The 'venue' matters too.

This wasn't a partisan event. It was a discussion on Arctic sovereignty at the Royal Canadian Geographical Society. You don't talk credibly about defending sovereignty, borders, and international legitimacy while entertaining internal breakup fantasies.

The contradiction is glaring. Alberta separatism has ... **no** credible economic plan ... **no** viable legal pathway ... **no** serious international support. It's about *grievance politics* - 'dressed up as' *empowerment*. **Harper** knows it. **Chrétien** knows it. And anyone who has actually 'governed' the country knows it too.

Apparently, the main issues driving the separatist [Alberta Prosperity Project] sentiment have been ... **a)**- the power disparity relative to Ottawa and other western provinces ... **b)**- a sense of distinctiveness with regard to Alberta's cultural and political identity ... **c)**- Canadian fiscal policy, particularly as it pertains to Alberta's OIL industry. The current Prime Minister, **Mark Carney**, is in deep discussions, with all Premiers at this time.

No, **CANADA** is “not” perfect ... Yes, it does have some real problems - but
NOTHING like racist / narcissistic / pedophile / dictator Trump's - faltering **USA!**

Breaking CANADA apart => will NOT solve any of its vital issues!
